**THE TWO GREAT COMMANDMENTS**

**~REPENT AND FOLLOW ME~**

We see a common theme running through all of the readings this week: In the first reading from Acts, Jesus says, "Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away." In the second reading from John, we hear, "Those who say, "I know him," but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them." Finally, He notes in the Gospel of Luke that, " ...repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name ..." As we noted last week, Jesus was always direct and to the point. He cared nothing for human respect. He sought only to please His Father. Jesus says two things here: 1) If you do not keep His commandments but proclaim to be His follower, you are a liar. 2) Repent (of #1), keep His commandments and be saved.

**~THE LAW OF GOD~**

Let us look at these two admonitions. First, what are Jesus' Commandments? The two great commandments that contain the whole law of God are: *Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with thy whole mind, and with thy whole strength; and Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself.*

**~WALKING THE WALK~**

So, the question is: Do we keep the first of Jesus' Commandments? Do we show that we love God with our whole heart, soul, mind and strength by going to Mass each Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation? Do we spend time in prayer each day? Do we submit willingly to all of the teachings of the Church (which He established) even if we do not perfectly understand them yet or agree with them at this point? (We must pray to be given this understanding.)

**~LOVE THY NEIGHBOR~**

How about the second great Commandment? Do we truly love our neighbor as we ought? Do we perform any of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy? The chief corporal works of mercy are: To feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the

naked, visit the imprisoned, shelter the homeless, visit the sick and bury the dead. The chief spiritual works of mercy are: To admonish the sinner, instruct the ignorant, counsel the doubtful, comfort the sorrowful, bear wrongs patiently, forgive all injuries and to pray for the living and the dead. If we do not, then Jesus tells us that it is never too late to repent, start anew and be saved.

**~IT'S NEVER TOO LATE~**

"God in His mercy, has given us a wonderful sacrament when we want to repent of sin and be forgiven. He has given us the sacrament of reconciliation, or confession. We see in **John 20: 21-23**: In his very first Resurrection appearance, our Lord gives this awesome power to his Apostles with the words: "Receive the **Holy Spirit**. If you forgive the sins of any, they are **forgiven**; if you retain the sins of any, they are **retained**." How could they forgive sins if they were not confessed? They could not. This authority comes through the gift of the Holy Spirit which precedes it. Does this remind of you what He told Peter (**Mt. 16: 19**) and then the other apostles (**Mt. 18:18**)? "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you **bind** on earth shall be **bound** in heaven, and whatever you **loose** on earth shall be **loosed** in heaven." This includes sins. Jesus allowed for us to receive spiritual consolation and counsel in this beautiful sacrament of the Church".

**~CONFESSION AND THE EARLY CHURCH~**

We also have recourse to the writings of the earliest Christians regarding the practice of Confession. Origen writes, in the 3rd century, "[A final method of forgiveness], albeit hard and laborious [is] the remission of sins through penance, when the sinner . . . does not shrink from declaring his sin to a priest of the Lord and from seeking medicine, after the manner of him who say, 'I said, "To the Lord I will accuse myself of my iniquity"' (Homilies on Leviticus 2:4 [A.D. 248]). We also hear from Tertullian, "[Regarding confession, some] flee from this work as being an exposure of themselves, or they put it

off from day to day. I presume they are more mindful of modesty than of salvation, like those who contract a disease in the more shameful parts of the body and shun making themselves known to the physicians; and thus they perish along with their own bashfulness" (Tertullian, *Repentance* 10:1 [A.D. 203]).

### ~PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH~

There are six precepts (commandments) of the Church. Below you see ten. Which four are **NOT** precepts?

1. To attend Mass on all Sundays and holy days of obligation.
2. To know the Lord's Prayer by memory.
3. To fast and to abstain on the days appointed.
4. To confess our sins at least once a year.
5. To receive Holy Communion during the Easter time.
6. To always bless yourself with Holy Water when entering or leaving a church.
7. To pray the Rosary daily
8. To contribute to the support of the Church.
9. To observe the laws of the Church concerning marriage.
10. To have your home blessed by a priest.

## QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

### ~CATHOLIC Q & A~

**Q:** What was the point of Jesus eating (fish) in front of His disciples in today's Gospel (Luke 24: 35-48)? Will our resurrected bodies have need of food?

**R::** Christ, our Savior, manifested the corporality of His glorified body through two principal proofs: First, He allowed his disciples to touch Him; second, He ate in their presence. While spirits, whether angels or separated souls, are indeed capable of appearing in a bodily form, the sight of our Lord eating was taken by the apostles as a certain manifestation of the truth of the resurrection of the flesh. The Fathers of the Church affirm that our Lord had no need of this food, but used the act of eating only as a means for the manifestation of the truth of the Resurrection. The eating of fish was given as a proof to his disciples that He had a true

body, and that this body contained within it all the normal organs which human bodies possess. That our Lord could eat proves that His risen body was neither a ghostly phantasm nor a mere exterior shell (hollow on the inside), but was a true and physical human body.

### ~ON LOVING GOD & YOUR NEIGHBOR~

To love God as He ought to be loved, we must be detached from all temporal love. We must love nothing but Him, or if we love anything else, we must love it only for His sake. -*Saint Peter Claver*

You either belong wholly to the world or wholly to God. You cannot please both God and the world at the same time. They are utterly opposed to each other in their thoughts, their desires, and their actions. -*Saint John Vianney*

The first end I propose in our daily work is to do the will of God; secondly, to do it in the manner he wills it; and thirdly to do it because it is his will. - *Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton*

Extend your mercy towards others, so that there can be no one in need whom you meet without helping. For what hope is there for us if God should withdraw His Mercy from us? -*Saint Vincent de Paul*

**LOS DOS GRANDES MANDAMIENTOS**

~ **ARREPIENTATE Y SIGUEME** ~

Vemos un tema común en todas las lecturas de esta semana: En la primera lectura de Hechos, Jesús dice: "Por tanto, arrepíentete y conviértete, para que tus pecados sean borrados". En la segunda lectura de Juan, escuchamos: "Los que dicen: "Yo le conozco", pero no guardan sus mandamientos, son mentirosos, y la verdad no está en ellos ". Finalmente, señala en el Evangelio de Lucas que, "... el arrepentimiento, para el perdón de los pecados, se predicaría en su nombre ..." Como notamos la semana pasada, Jesús siempre fue directo y al grano. No le importaba nada el respeto humano. Solo buscaba agradar a su Padre. Jesús dice dos cosas aquí: 1) Si no guardas Sus mandamientos, pero proclamas ser Su seguidor, eres un mentiroso. 2) Arrepíentase (del # 1), guarde sus mandamientos y sea salvo.

~ **LA LEY DE DIOS** ~

Miremos estas dos amonestaciones. Primero, ¿cuáles son los mandamientos de Jesús? Los dos grandes mandamientos que contienen toda la ley de Dios son: Amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, y con toda tu alma, y con toda tu mente y con todas tus fuerzas; y amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo.

~ **CAMINANDO EL PASEO** ~

Entonces, la pregunta es: ¿Guardamos el primero de los mandamientos de Jesús? ¿Demostramos que amamos a Dios con todo nuestro corazón, alma, mente y fuerzas yendo a misa todos los domingos y en los días santos de obligación? ¿Pasamos tiempo en oración todos los días? ¿Nos sometemos voluntariamente a todas las enseñanzas de la Iglesia (que Él estableció) incluso si aún no las entendemos perfectamente o estamos de acuerdo con ellas en este momento? (Debemos orar para recibir este entendimiento).

~ **AMA A TU PRÓJIMO** ~

¿Qué tal el segundo gran mandamiento? ¿Amamos verdaderamente a nuestro prójimo como deberíamos? ¿Realizamos alguna de las obras de misericordia corporales y espirituales? Las principales obras corporales de misericordia son: Alimentar al hambriento, dar de beber al sediento, vestir al desnudo.

visitar a los presos, albergar a los desamparados, visitar a los enfermos y enterrar a los muertos. Las principales obras espirituales de misericordia son: amonestar al pecador, instruir al ignorante, aconsejar al dudoso, consolar al afligido, soportar los agravios con paciencia, perdonar todas las ofensas y orar por los vivos y los muertos. Si no lo hacemos, entonces Jesús nos dice que nunca es demasiado tarde para arrepentirse, comenzar de nuevo y ser salvos.

~ **NUNCA ES DEMASIADO TARDE** ~

"Dios, en su misericordia, nos ha dado un sacramento maravilloso cuando queremos arrepentirnos del pecado y ser perdonados. Nos ha dado el sacramento de la reconciliación o la confesión. Vemos en Juan 20: 21-23: En su primera aparición en la Resurrección, nuestro Señor da este asombroso poder a sus Apóstoles con las palabras: "Recibe el Espíritu Santo. Si perdonas los pecados de alguno, le quedan perdonados; si retienes los pecados de alguno, se los retiene ". ¿Cómo iban a perdonar los pecados si no los confesaban? Ellos no pudieron. Esta autoridad proviene del don del Espíritu Santo que la precede. ¿Le recuerda esto lo que le dijo a Pedro (Mt. 16:19) y luego a los otros apóstoles (Mt. 18:18)? "Te daré las llaves del reino de los cielos, y todo lo que ates en la tierra quedará atado en los cielos, y todo lo que desates en la tierra quedará desatado en los cielos". Esto incluye los pecados. Jesús permitió que recibiéramos consuelo espiritual y consejo en este hermoso sacramento de la Iglesia".

~ **LA CONFESIÓN Y LA IGLESIA PRIMITIVA** ~

También recurrimos a los escritos de los primeros cristianos sobre la práctica de la Confesión. Orígenes escribe, en el siglo III, "[Un método final de perdón], aunque duro y laborioso [es] la remisión de los pecados a través de la penitencia, cuando el pecador ... no rehúye declarar su pecado a un sacerdote del Señor y de buscar medicinas, a la manera de quien dice: 'Dije: "Al Señor me acusaré de mi iniquidad"' (Homilías sobre Levítico 2: 4 [248 d. C.]). También escuchamos de Tertuliano, "[En cuanto a la confesión, algunos] huyen de este trabajo como una exposición de sí mismos, o lo postergan día a día. Presumo que están más preocupados por el pudor que por la salvación,



como los que contraen una enfermedad en las partes más vergonzosas del cuerpo y evitan darse a conocer a los médicos; y así perecen junto con su propia timidez "(Tertuliano, Arrepentimiento 10: 1 [203 d. C.]).

4. Confesar nuestros pecados al menos una vez al año.

6. Bendecirse siempre con Agua Bendita al entrar o salir de una iglesia.
7. Rezar el Rosario todos los días
8. Contribuir al sostenimiento de la Iglesia.

Si bien los espíritus, ya sean ángeles o almas separadas, son capaces de aparecer en forma corporal, los apóstoles tomaron la vista de nuestro Señor comiendo como una manifestación cierta de la verdad de la resurrección de la carne. Los Padres de la Iglesia afirman que nuestro Señor no tuvo necesidad de este alimento, sino que utilizó el acto de comer solo como un medio para la manifestación de la verdad de la Resurrección.

El comer pescado se les dio a sus discípulos como prueba de que Él tenía un cuerpo verdadero y que este cuerpo contenía en su interior todos los órganos normales que posee el cuerpo humano. Que nuestro Señor pudiera comer prueba que Su cuerpo resucitado no era ni un fantasma fantasmal ni un mero caparazón exterior (hueco por dentro), sino que era un cuerpo humano verdadero y físico.

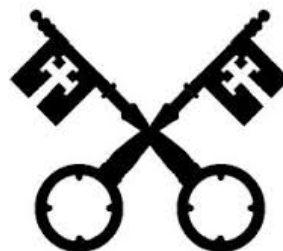
