CHRISTMAS MEDITATIONS

~VEN. FULTON SHEEN~

In *Manifestations of Christ*, published in 1932, Ven. Sheen wrote: "As we gather about the crib of Bethlehem, we feel that we are in the presence of a new Paradise of Beauty and Love... and the name of that Paradise is Mary. And if we could have been there in that stable on that first Christmas night, we might have seen that Paradise of the Incarnation but we should not be able to recollect whether her face was beautiful or not.. For what would have impressed us, and made us forget all else, would have been the lovely, sinless soul that shone through her eyes like two celestial suns. If we could have stood at the gates to that Paradise, we would have less peered at it as into it, for what would have impressed us would not have been any external qualities, though these would have been ravishing, but rather the qualities of her soul—her simplicity, innocence, humility, and above all, her purity... Christmas takes on a new meaning when the Mother is seen with the Babe. In fact, the heavens and the earth seem almost to exchange

places. Years ago, we used to think of the heavens as 'way up there.' Then one day the God of the heavens came to this earth, and that hour when she held the Babe in her arms, it became true to say that with her we now 'look down' at heaven." <https://epicpew.com/timeless-christmas-wisdom-from-venerable-fulton-sheen/>

~PADRE PIO~

"According to Capuchin priest Fr. Joseph Mary Elder, "At his home in Pietrelcina, he prepared the crib himself. He would often begin working on it as early as October. While pasturing the family's sheep with friends, he would search for clay to use to fashion the small statues of shepherds, sheep, and the magi. He took particular care in crafting the infant Jesus, making and re-making it continually until he felt he had it just right." This devotion remained with him during his entire life. In a letter to spiritual daughter, he wrote, "When the Holy Novena begins in honor of the Baby Jesus, it felt as though my spirit were being born again to a new life. I felt as though my heart were too small to embrace all our heavenly blessings."

~MIRACULOUS VISION~

"Midnight Mass in particular was a joyous celebration for Padre Pio, who celebrated it every year, taking many hours to carefully celebrate the Holy Mass. His soul was lifted up to God with great joy, a joy that others could easily see. Additionally, witnesses have recounted how they would see Padre Pio holding the Baby Jesus. This was not a porcelain statue, but the Baby Jesus himself in a miraculous vision. Renzo Allegri recounts the following story:

We were reciting the rosary while waiting for the Mass. Padre Pio was praying with us. All of a sudden, in an aura of light, I saw the Baby Jesus appear in his arms. Padre Pio was transfigured, his eyes gazing upon the glowing child in his arms, his face transformed by an astonished smile. When the vision disappeared, Padre Pio realized from the way I was looking at him that I had seen everything. But he drew close to me and told me not to mention it to anyone. A similar story is told by Fr. Raffaele da Sant'Elia, who lived next to Padre Pio for many years. I had got up to go to the church for the Midnight Mass of 1924. The corridor was huge and dark, and the only illumination was the flame of a small oil lamp. Through the shadows I could see that Padre Pio, too, was making his way to the church. He had left his room and was making his way slowly along the corridor. I realized he was swathed in a band of light. I took a better look and saw that he had the Baby Jesus in his arms. I just stood there, transfixed, in the doorway of my room, and fell to my knees. Padre Pio passed by, all aglow. He didn't even notice I was there. These supernatural events highlight the deep and abiding love of Padre Pio for God. His love was further marked by simplicity and humility, with a heart wide open to receive whatever heavenly graced God had planned for him. May we too open our hearts to receive the Baby Jesus on Christmas day and let God's unfathomable love overcome us with Christian joy." <https://aleteia.org/2018/12/16/when-padre-pio-celebrated-christmas-the-baby-jesus-would-miraculously-appear/#>

~THE HOLY TRINITY IS ... ~

like a family, and God's Son lived family life.

"Language is like currency. There must be a common understanding of its value for it to function as an effective means of exchange. When that common agreement deteriorates, wages, prices, and costs cut anchor, and economies drift. Similarly, a word can drop in value, suffer inflation, or entirely lose its meaning when a language group loses a common understanding of its meaning. This has happened to the word "family." Some have inflated the value of "family" to mean *any* grouping of two or more people, or even one person and a dog. For others, "family" has lost value since their personal experiences of family life were dysfunctional and damaged their mental and emotional development. On today's Feast of the Holy Family, the Church defends normalcy. She holds up what has always been. She offers her faithful *the* model of what family life should be."

~THE MEANING OF THE WORD~

"Reflections on the Holy Family presuppose a lack of ambiguity on what the word family means. Common cultural understandings of marriage and family create space for more mature spiritual and theological reflection. But if a certain percentage of a culture matures without, for example, experiencing the love, discipline, and guidance of a good father, then it is difficult to talk about the goodness, mercy, and justice of God the Father. Those who didn't have a father, or whose father was largely absent, will struggle to connect with God the Father being at the same time a judge, a source of mercy, and a font of unconditional love. The same applies to family life in general. A person lacking a personal experience of intact family, even a family replete with tensions and imperfections, will fail to understand what "family" even means."

~GOD'S CHOICE~

"Today we commemorate the fact that God chose to be born and raised in the same environment as all men, when He could have chosen otherwise. We can do no better than to reflect on the beautiful and profound words of Pope Benedict XVI in his message for the 2008 World Day of Peace: *The first form of communion between persons is that born of the love of a man and a woman who decide to enter a stable union in order to build together a new family...The natural family, as an intimate communion of life and love, based on marriage between a man and a woman, constitutes "the primary place of 'humanization' for the person and society," and a "cradle of life and love"...Indeed, in a healthy family life we experience some of the fundamental elements of peace: justice and love between brothers and sisters, the role of authority expressed by parents, loving concern for the members who are weaker because of youth, sickness or old age, mutual help in the necessities of life, readiness to accept others and, if necessary, to forgive them. For this reason, the family is the first and indispensable teacher of peace...Where can young people gradually learn to savor the genuine "taste" of peace better than in the original "nest" which nature prepares for them?... This point merits special reflection: everything that serves to weaken the family based on the marriage of a man and a woman, everything that directly or indirectly stands in the way of its openness to the responsible acceptance of a new life, everything that obstructs its right to be primarily responsible for the education of its children, constitutes an objective obstacle on the road to peace."* <https://mycatholic.life/saints/saints-of-the-liturgical-year/the-holy-family-of-jesus-mary-and-joseph-feast/>

MEDITACIONES NAVIDENAS

~ VENERABLE FULTON SHEEN ~

En Manifestaciones de Cristo, publicado en 1932, Venerable Sheen escribió: "Mientras nos reunimos alrededor del pesebre de Belén, sentimos que estamos en la presencia de un nuevo Paraíso de Belleza y Amor ... y el nombre de ese Paraíso es María. Y si hubiéramos estado allí en ese establo esa primera noche de Navidad, podríamos haber visto ese Paraíso de la Encarnación, pero no podríamos recordar si su rostro era hermoso o no, porque lo que nos hubiera impresionado, y nos hubiera hecho olvidar todo lo demás, hubiera sido el alma hermosa y sin pecado que brillaba a través de sus ojos como dos soles celestiales. Si hubiéramos podido estar a las puertas de ese Paraíso, lo habríamos mirado menos como en él, porque lo que nos habría impresionado no habría sido ninguna cualidad externa, aunque estas hubieran sido deslumbrantes, sino más bien las cualidades de su alma, su sencillez, inocencia, humildad y, sobre todo, su pureza ... La Navidad adquiere un nuevo sentido cuando se ve a la Madre con el Niño. De hecho, los cielos y la tierra parecen casi intercambiar de lugares. Hace años, solíamos pensar en los cielos como 'allá arriba'. Entonces, un día, el Dios de los cielos vino a esta tierra, y esa hora en que sostuvo al bebé en sus brazos, se hizo cierto decir que con ella ahora 'miramos hacia abajo' al cielo". <https://epicpew.com/timeless-christmas-wisdom-from-venerable-fulton-sheen/>

~ PADRE PIO ~

"Según el sacerdote Capuchino P. Joseph Mary Elder, "En su casa de Pietrelcina, él mismo preparó la cuna. A menudo comenzaba a trabajar en él ya en Octubre. Mientras apacentaba las ovejas de la familia con amigos, buscaba arcilla para modelar las pequeñas estatuas de pastores, ovejas y magos.

Tuvo especial cuidado en la elaboración del niño Jesús, haciéndolo y rehaciéndolo continuamente hasta que sintió que lo tenía perfecto". Esta devoción permaneció con él durante toda su vida. En una carta a su hija espiritual, escribió: "Cuando comienza la Santa Novena en honor del Niño Jesús, sentí como si mi espíritu estuviera naciendo de nuevo a una nueva vida. Sentí como si mi corazón fuera demasiado pequeño para abrazar todas nuestras bendiciones celestiales".

~ VISIÓN MILAGROSA ~

"La Misa de Medianoche en particular fue una celebración alegre para el Padre Pío, quien la celebró todos los años, tomando muchas horas para celebrar cuidadosamente la Santa Misa. Su alma fue elevada a Dios con gran alegría, una alegría que otros podían ver fácilmente. Además, los testigos han contado cómo verían al Padre Pío sosteniendo al Niño Jesús. Esta no era una estatua de porcelana, sino el mismo Niño Jesús en una visión milagrosa. Renzo Allegri relata la siguiente historia: Estábamos rezando el rosario mientras esperábamos la Misa. El Padre Pio rezaba con nosotros. De repente, en un aura de luz, vi al Niño Jesús aparecer en sus brazos. El Padre Pío se transfiguró, sus ojos contemplaron al niño resplandeciente en sus brazos, su rostro transformado por una sonrisa de asombro. Cuando la visión desapareció, el Padre Pio se dio cuenta por la forma en que lo miraba que lo había visto todo. Pero se acercó a mí y me dijo que no se lo mencionara a nadie. Una historia similar la cuenta el P. Raffaele da Sant'Elia, que vivió junto al Padre Pio durante muchos años. Me había levantado para ir a la iglesia para la Misa de medianoche de 1924. El pasillo era enorme y oscuro, y la única iluminación era la llama de una pequeña lámpara de aceite. A través de las sombras pude ver que el Padre Pío también se dirigía a la iglesia. Había salido de su habitación y avanzaba lentamente por el pasillo. Me di cuenta de que estaba envuelto en una banda de luz. Miré mejor y vi que tenía al Niño Jesús en sus brazos. Me quedé allí, paralizado, en la puerta de mi habitación, y caí de rodillas. El Padre Pío pasó, todo resplandeciente. Ni siquiera se dio cuenta de que estaba allí. Estos eventos sobrenaturales resaltan el amor profundo y permanente del Padre Pío por Dios. Su amor se caracterizó además por la sencillez y la humildad, con un corazón bien abierto para recibir cualquier gracia celestial que Dios había planeado para él. →

LA SAGRADA FAMILIA

~ LA SANTA TRINIDAD ES ... ~
como una familia, y el Hijo de Dios vivió la vida familiar.

"El lenguaje es como una moneda. Debe haber un entendimiento común de su valor para que funcione como un medio de intercambio efectivo. Cuando ese acuerdo común se deteriora, los salarios, los precios y los costos se anclan y las economías se desvían. De manera similar, una palabra puede perder valor, sufrir inflación o perder por completo su significado cuando un grupo lingüístico pierde una comprensión común de su significado. Esto le ha sucedido a la palabra "familia". Algunos han inflado el valor de "familia" para significar cualquier grupo de dos o más personas, o incluso una persona y un perro. Para otros, la "familia" ha perdido valor ya que sus experiencias personales de la vida familiar fueron disfuncionales y dañaron su desarrollo mental y emocional. En la Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia de hoy, la Iglesia defiende la normalidad. Ella sostiene lo que siempre ha sido. Ofrece a sus fieles el modelo de lo que debe ser la vida familiar".

~ EL SIGNIFICADO DE LA PALABRA ~

"Las reflexiones sobre la Sagrada Familia presuponen una falta de ambigüedad sobre lo que significa la palabra familia. La comprensión cultural común del matrimonio y la familia crea un espacio para una reflexión espiritual y teológica más madura. Pero si un cierto porcentaje de una cultura madura sin, por ejemplo, experimentar el amor, la disciplina y la guía de un buen padre, entonces es difícil hablar de la bondad, la misericordia y la justicia de Dios Padre. Aquellos que no tuvieron un padre, o cuyo padre estuvo ausente en gran parte, tendrán dificultades para conectarse con Dios el Padre siendo al mismo tiempo un juez, una fuente de misericordia y una fuente de amor incondicional. Lo mismo se aplica a la vida familiar en general. Una persona que carece de una experiencia personal de familia intacta, incluso una familia repleta de tensiones e imperfecciones, no entenderá lo que significa "familia".

~ LA ELECCIÓN DE DIOS ~

"Hoy conmemoramos el hecho de que Dios eligió nacer y criarse en el mismo ambiente que todos los

hombres, cuando pudo haber elegido otra cosa. No podemos hacer nada mejor que reflexionar sobre las hermosas y profundas palabras del Papa Benedicto XVI en su mensaje para la Jornada Mundial de la Paz 2008: *La primera forma de comunión entre las personas es la que nace del amor de un hombre y una mujer que deciden entrar en una unión estable para construir juntos una nueva familia ... Lo natural La familia, como íntima comunión de vida y amor, basada en el matrimonio entre un hombre y una mujer, constituye "el lugar primario de 'humanización' de la persona y la sociedad", y una "cuna de la vida y del amor"...
