MY CATHOLIC FAITH

ON GRATITUDE & SAINTS

~FROM THE PASTOR~

Our first reading and our Gospel reading tell us about lepers who were made clean. This teaches us a valuable lesson about gratitude. Also, we'll read about three saints of October. Two of the ones I chose are not so well known, one of those being a member of the Borgia family! Let's read on ...

THE OBLIGATION OF GRATITUDE

~GRATITUDE~

"The Bible accounts of Namaan the Syrian and Jesus' healing of the 10 lepers shows us that gratitude is an obligation of justice. In the ancient Near East, leprosy was a particularly heavy burden to bear since it meant complete social isolation. No wonder, then, that Namaan would travel all the way from his native Syria to Israel when told that there was hope of finding a cure there. So what if Israel was the enemy of Syria and he was a Syrian army commander? So what if he worshiped Syrian gods rather than the God of Israel? It was worth a shot. Nothing else had worked."

~NAAMAN~

"Namaan was healed instantly and completely. And his response was just matter-of-fact. He was obliged to express his gratitude by offering a gift. Elisha refused to accept it because the healing had not come from Elisha. It had come from God. When Namaan recognized this, he loaded up a cart with soil from the Holy Land so that he could erect an altar at home to the God of Israel. And he pledged to worship no other god from that day forward. Namaan was a pagan. He probably never heard of the Ten Commandments (Ex 20) which starts off with "I am the Lord your God and you shall not have any strange gods before me." But Namaan did not need Divine Revelation to tell him what he already knew by way of common sense. He had just received a new lease on life from the God of his enemies. From that moment on, he realized he owed a debt of gratitude to this God that could never fully be repaid, but he was bound to try anyway. None of the other "gods"

had been able to give him his life back. They had no power to do so and he owed them nothing. Namaan was a just man and so was determined to pay what he owed as best as he could."

~HOW IRONIC~

"How ironic! Israel had experienced extraordinary blessings from God for hundreds of years but failed to express gratitude to God. Instead, they flirted with the idols that Namaan abandoned. Rather than honoring the prophets, they persecuted them."

~WE OWE GOD EVERYTHING~

"We see a similar irony in Luke's story of the 10 lepers (Luke 17:11-19). An encounter with Jesus brings these ten outcasts total healing and restoration to society. Yet none of the Israelites among them takes the time to return to thank Jesus. Only one man does -and he just happens to be a Samaritan heretic. Worship of God first and foremost is a strict obligation of justice. We were created out of nothing, through no effort of our own. We were saved by grace; it was not our own doing (Ephesians 2:4). On both counts, we owe God everything. We can never adequately repay him, and so owe him a lifetime of gratitude."

SAINTS OF OCTOBER

~ST. FRANCIS BORGIA~

“Francis was a young nobleman at the court of the King of Spain. He became a Duke when he was only thirty-three and lived a happy, peaceful life with his wife Eleanor and their eight children. But unlike so many other powerful nobles, Francis was a perfect Christian gentleman, a true man of God and his great joy was to receive Holy Communion often. This happy life ended when his beloved wife died. Francis did something that astonished all the nobles of Spain; he gave up his Dukedom to his son Charles and became a Jesuit priest. So many people came to his first Mass that they had to set up an altar outdoors, but his Superior tested him by treating him in exactly the opposite way he had been used to all his forty-one years of life. He who had once been a Duke had to help the cook, carrying wood for the fire and sweeping the kitchen. When he served food to the priests and brothers, he had to kneel down in front of them all and beg them to forgive him for being so clumsy! Still he never once complained or grumbled. The only time he became angry was when anyone treated him with respect as if he was still a Duke. Once a doctor who had to take care of a painful wound Francis had gotten said to him: "I am afraid, my lord, that I have to hurt your grace." The saint answered that he would not hurt him more than he was right then by calling him "my lord" and "your grace." It was not too long before the humble priest accomplished wonderful works for God's glory as he preached everywhere and advised many important people. He spread the Society of Jesus all over Spain and in Portugal. When he was made Superior General of the Jesuits, he sent missionaries all over the world. Under his guidance, the Jesuits grew to be a very great help to the Church in many lands. Through all such success, St. Francis Borgia remained completely humble. His feast day is October 10.”

~ST. TERESA OF AVILA~

Teresa lived in an age of exploration as well as political, social, and religious upheaval. It was the 16th century, a time of turmoil and reform. She was born before the Protestant Reformation and died almost 20 years after the closing of the Council of Trent. The gift of God to Teresa in and through which she became holy and left her mark

on the Church and the world is threefold: She was a woman; she was a contemplative; she was an active reformer. As a woman, Teresa stood on her own two feet, even in the man's world of her time. She was “her own woman,” entering the Carmelites despite strong opposition from her father. She is a person wrapped not so much in silence as in mystery. Beautiful, talented, outgoing, adaptable, affectionate, courageous, enthusiastic, she was totally human. Like Jesus, she was a mystery of paradoxes: wise, yet practical; intelligent, yet much in tune with her experience; a mystic, yet an energetic reformer; a holy woman, a womanly woman. Teresa was a woman “for God,” a woman of prayer, discipline, and compassion. Her heart belonged to God. Her ongoing conversion was an arduous lifelong struggle, involving ongoing purification and suffering. She was misunderstood, misjudged, and opposed in her efforts at reform. Yet she struggled on, courageous and faithful; she struggled with her own mediocrity, her illness, her opposition. And in the midst of all this she clung to God in life and in prayer. Her writings on prayer and contemplation are drawn from her experience: powerful, practical, and graceful. ... Teresa was a woman “for others.” Though a contemplative, she spent much of her time and energy seeking to reform herself and the Carmelites, to lead them back to the full observance of the primitive Rule. She founded over a half-dozen new monasteries. She traveled, wrote, fought—always to renew, to reform. In her self, in her prayer, in her life, in her efforts to reform, in all the people she touched, she was a woman for others, a woman who inspired and gave life. Her writings, especially the *Way of Perfection* and *The Interior Castle*, have helped generations of believers.” Her feast day is October 15. www.franciscanmedia.org/saint-of-the-day/saint-teresa-of-avila

~ST. ANTHONY DANIEL~

Martyred Jesuit missionary slain by the Iroquois. Anthony was born in Dieppe, France, in 1601, and became a Jesuit in 1621. After teaching in European classrooms, he arrived in Arcadia, Canada in 1632, and was sent to Quebec a year later. There he founded a school for the young men of Huron, being successful in this mission. Captured by the Iroquois, the enemy of the Hurons, Anthony was slain near Hillsdale, Ontario, at Teanaustaye on July 4. He was canonized in 1930 and is venerated as a Martyr of North America.” His feast day is Oct. 19. https://www.catholic.org/saints/saint.php?saint_id=1443

SOBRE LA GRATITUD Y LOS SANTOS

Nuestra primera lectura y la lectura del Evangelio nos hablan de leprosos que quedaron limpios. Esto nos enseña una valiosa lección sobre la gratitud. Además, leeremos sobre tres santos de octubre. Dos de los elegidos no son tan conocidos, ¡uno de ellos es un miembro de la familia Borgia! Sigamos leyendo...

LA OBLIGACIÓN DEL AGRADECIMIENTO

~GRATITUD~

"Los relatos bíblicos de Naaman el Sirio y de la curación de los 10 leprosos por parte de Jesús nos muestran que la gratitud es una obligación de justicia. En el antiguo Cercano Oriente, la lepra era una carga particularmente pesada de llevar, ya que significaba un completo aislamiento social. No es de extrañar, pues, que Naaman viajara desde su Siria natal hasta Israel cuando le dijeron que allí había esperanza de encontrar una cura. ¿Y qué si Israel era el enemigo de Siria y él era un comandante del ejército sirio? ¿Y qué si adoraba a los dioses sirios en lugar del Dios de Israel? Valía la pena intentarlo. Nada más había funcionado".

~NAAMAN~

"Namaan se curó al instante y por completo. Y su respuesta fue simplemente un hecho. Se vio obligado a expresar su gratitud ofreciendo un regalo. Eliseo se negó a aceptarlo porque la curación no había venido de Eliseo. Había venido de Dios. Cuando Namaan reconoció esto, cargó un carro con tierra de Tierra Santa para poder erigir un altar en su casa al Dios de Israel. Y se comprometió a no adorar a ningún otro dios a partir de ese día. Namaan era un pagano. Probablemente nunca oyó hablar de los Diez Mandamientos (Ex 20) que comienzan con "Yo soy el Señor tu Dios y no tendrás dioses extraños delante de mí". Pero Namaan no necesitaba que la Revelación Divina le dijera lo que ya sabía por medio del sentido común. Acababa de recibir una nueva oportunidad de vida del Dios de sus enemigos. A partir de ese momento, se dio cuenta de que tenía una deuda de gratitud con este Dios que nunca podría ser pagada del todo, pero estaba obligado a intentarlo de todos modos. Ninguno de los otros "dioses" había sido capaz de devolverle la vida. No tenían poder para hacerlo y él no les debía nada. Namaan era un hombre justo y por eso estaba decidido a pagar lo que debía lo mejor posible".

~CUÁNTA IRONÍA~

"¡Qué ironía! Israel había experimentado bendiciones extraordinarias de Dios durante cientos de años, pero no expresó su gratitud a Dios. En cambio, coquetearon con los ídolos que Namaan abandonó. En lugar de honrar a los profetas, los persiguieron. "

~LE DEBEMOS TODO A DIOS~

"Vemos una ironía similar en la historia de Lucas de los diez leprosos (*Lucas 17:11-19*). Un encuentro con Jesús trae a estos diez parias la curación total y la restauración a la sociedad. Sin embargo, ninguno de los israelitas que se encuentran entre ellos se toma el tiempo de volver a dar las gracias a Jesús. Sólo un hombre lo hace, y resulta que es un hereje samaritano. El culto a Dios es, ante todo, una estricta obligación de justicia. Fuimos creados de la nada, sin esfuerzo propio. Fuimos salvados por la gracia; no fue obra nuestra (*Efesios 2:4*). En ambos casos, se lo debemos todo a Dios. Nunca podremos recompensarle adecuadamente, por lo que le debemos toda una vida de gratitud".

SANTOS DE OCTUBRE

~SAN FRANCISCO BORGIA~

"Francisco era un joven noble de la corte del rey de España. Se convirtió en duque cuando sólo tenía treinta y tres años y vivió una vida feliz y tranquila con su esposa Leonor y sus ocho hijos. Pero a diferencia de tantos otros nobles poderosos, Francisco era un perfecto caballero cristiano, un verdadero hombre de Dios y su gran alegría era comulgar a menudo. Esta vida feliz terminó cuando su amada esposa murió. Francisco hizo algo que asombró a todos los nobles de España; cedió su Ducado a su hijo Carlos y se hizo sacerdote jesuita. A su primera misa acudió tanta gente que tuvieron que montar un altar al aire libre, pero su Superior le puso a prueba tratándole exactamente al revés de lo que había estado acostumbrado durante todos sus cuarenta y un años de vida. El que antes había sido duque tuvo que ayudar al cocinero, llevando leña para el fuego y barriendo →

la cocina. Cuando servía la comida a los sacerdotes y a los hermanos, tenía que arrodillarse delante de todos ellos y rogarles que le perdonaran por ser tan torpe. Sin embargo, nunca se quejó ni refunfuñó. La única vez que se enfadaba era cuando alguien le trataba con respeto como si todavía fuera un duque. Una vez, un médico que tenía que curar una dolorosa herida que Francisco había recibido le dijo "Tengo miedo, mi señor, de tener que herir a vuestra gracia". El santo le contestó que no le heriría más de lo que estaba en ese momento llamándole "mi señor" y "vuestra gracia". No pasó mucho tiempo antes de que el humilde sacerdote realizara obras maravillosas para la gloria de Dios, ya que predicaba por todas partes y aconsejaba a muchas personas importantes. Difundió la Compañía de Jesús por toda España y en Portugal. Cuando fue nombrado superior general de los jesuitas, envió misioneros por todo el mundo. Bajo su dirección, los jesuitas llegaron a ser una gran ayuda para la Iglesia en muchas tierras. A través de todo este éxito, San Francisco de Borja permaneció completamente humilde. Su fiesta es el 10 de octubre".

~SANTA TERESA DE ÁVILA~

Teresa vivió en una época de exploración, así como de agitación política, social y religiosa. Era el siglo XVI, una época de agitación y reforma. Nació antes de la Reforma Protestante y murió casi 20 años después de la clausura del Concilio de Trento. El don de Dios a Teresa en y por el que se hizo santa y dejó su huella sobre la Iglesia y el mundo es triple: Fue una mujer; fue una contemplativa; fue una reformadora activa. Como mujer, Teresa se valió por sí misma, incluso en el mundo de los hombres de su época. Fue "su propia mujer", entrando en el Carmelo a pesar de la fuerte oposición de su padre. Es una persona envuelta no tanto en el silencio como en el misterio. Hermosa, talentosa, extrovertida, adaptable, afectuosa, valiente, entusiasta, era totalmente humana. Como Jesús, era un misterio de paradojas: sabia, pero práctica; inteligente, pero muy en sintonía con su experiencia; mística, pero energética reformadora; una mujer santa, una mujer de mujer. Teresa era una mujer "para Dios", una mujer de oración, disciplina y compasión. Su corazón pertenecía a Dios. Su conversión permanente fue una ardua lucha de toda la vida, que implicaba una purificación y un sufrimiento continuos. Fue incomprendida, juzgada erróneamente y se opuso a sus esfuerzos de reforma. Sin embargo, siguió luchando, valiente y fiel; luchó contra su propia mediocridad, su enfermedad y su →

oposición. Y en medio de todo esto, se aferró a Dios en la vida y en la oración. Sus escritos sobre la oración y la contemplación están sacados de su experiencia: poderosos, prácticos y llenos de gracia. ... Teresa fue una mujer "para los demás". Aunque era contemplativa, dedicó gran parte de su tiempo y energía a intentar reformarse a sí misma y a las carmelitas, para llevarlas de nuevo a la plena observancia de la Regla primitiva. Fundó más de media docena de nuevos monasterios. Viajó, escribió, luchó, siempre para renovar, para reformar. En su persona, en su oración, en su vida, en sus esfuerzos de reforma, en todas las personas que tocó, fue una mujer para los demás, una mujer que inspiró y dio vida. Sus escritos, especialmente Camino de perfección y El castillo interior, han ayudado a generaciones de creyentes". Su fiesta es el 15 de octubre.

~SAN ANTONIO DANIEL~

Misionero jesuita mártir asesinado por los Iroqueses. Antonio nació en Dieppe, Francia, en 1601, y se hizo jesuita en 1621. Después de enseñar en las aulas europeas, llegó a Arcadia, Canadá, en 1632, y fue enviado a Quebec un año después. Allí fundó una escuela para los jóvenes Hurones, teniendo éxito en esta misión. Capturado por los Iroqueses, enemigos de los Hurones, Antonio fue asesinado cerca de Hillsdale, Ontario, en Teanaustaye, el 4 de julio. Fue canonizado en 1930 y es venerado como mártir de América del Norte". Su fiesta es el 19 de octubre.
