RAISED FROM THE DEAD

~SEPARATING FACT FROM FICTION~

Living in the pluralistic, secular society that we live in, we are subjected to many opinions and "facts" that are simply not true. In fact, it is often hard to sift fact from fiction these days. Thank God we have the Church to guide us and give us the Truth with a capital T! One fiction, often presented as fact, is the teaching that the Resurrection of Jesus was symbolic, not literal, and should be seen as a spiritual awakening or resurrection. Why is this point—the bodily Resurrection of the Lord -so important? Because, as the excerpts from the article below by Fr. Albert J. Hebert, tell us, it is central to our Faith!

~MOST MOMENTOUS EVENT IN HISTORY~

"The Resurrection of Jesus Christ was the turning point in human history and is the basis of the Christian Faith. It completed the work of man's salvation and redemption by which "the gates of Heaven," closed since the sin of Adam, were again opened. The Passion, death and Resurrection of Our Lord constitute the most momentous event in the history of the world. St. Paul summed it all up when he stated: "And if Christ be not risen again, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain ... And if Christ be not risen again, your faith is vain, for you are yet in your sins." (1 Cor. 15:14, 17). Thus the Resurrection of Christ is the basis of our faith. If it did not happen, Christianity is based on a lie and we have no hope of our own resurrection. ... The Resurrection of Christ from the dead was possible only because He was both divine and human. He was the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity from all eternity, but He had also taken to Himself a human nature in the womb of the Virgin Mary, by the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus could suffer and die in His human nature, but because He was a Divine Person, all that

nature, but because He was a Divine Person, all that He suffered had a divine value that purchased universal redemption for all mankind. All men would not make use of that redemption, so all would not be saved, but Christ had made salvation available to all.

~INDEED, HE DID RISE~

... The Jews, telling Pilate of Jesus' prediction that He would rise again after three days, asked for a guard to be stationed at the tomb, lest His disciples steal the body and say Jesus was raised from the dead. Pilate agreed, gave them a guard, and ordered a seal placed on the tomb. The action of the Jews is one more illustration of how God makes use of the folly and evil intentions of men to confound their plans and further His own designs and glory. Here was established a guard composed of soldiers of the greatest and most famous human power in all history, the Roman Empire. Here, one might say, stood the power of the Roman Emperor-his soldiers, his seal. It was all there to assure that Jesus' body would stay in that tomb and that there would be no human tampering with it! How naive can men be! But there was indeed one thing that all these various men did know for sure: they were guarding a DEAD body. But lo! On Sunday morning there was a mighty earthquake, and the angel of the Lord, resembling a flash of lightning with his garments as dazzling as snow, rolled the stone back and seated himself upon it. His action seemed to declare that the stone which was guarding death, as well as the power of the Roman government, was ingloriously sat upon and conquered. ... With the benefit of 20 centuries of hindsight, those of us living today (even those without faith) can see that the stupendous and wondrous teaching that Christ is risen and that His faithful followers shall also rise again has indeed been confirmed by God. The Catholic cathedrals, churches and chapels which testify to this doctrine are to be found throughout the world. Every one of these churches, sheltering the true risen God in its tabernacle, is the fulfilment of the ancient Temple of Jerusalem. The poorest Catholic chapel, literally containing Almighty God Himself in the Blessed Sacrament, infinitely surpasses that magnificent temple, which despite its splendor was only a pre-figurement of the Tabernacles of the holy Catholic Church." QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

~QUESTIONS ABOUT THE RESURRECTION~

Q: Why did Christ continue to have evidence of His wounds after the Resurrection?

A: Thomas Aquinas gave an excellent summary of reasons: to confirm the disciples' faith, to rightly intercede for humanity, to show the Father what he had suffered for humanity, to demonstrate the continuity of the pre and post-Easter body, and to show on the last day to all humans "an everlasting trophy of his victory"

Q: What are some of the fallacies that people believe about the Resurrection of the Lord?

A: Some argue for a spiritual resurrection, in which case, Jesus' spirit lived on while his body died, and is still dead. Besides being against the witness of Scripture and Church tradition, this view is also anti-creation. It makes our redemption outside the realm of history and creation. Others argue for a solely metaphorical or legendary interpretation of the resurrection. In this case, the resurrection is only a story and not an event in history. In that case, we are still not delivered from death and sin. All of us will die a non-metaphorical death, so we hope for a non-metaphorical resurrection! Others describe the resurrection of Jesus as Jesus' teachings living on in his followers. However, without the resurrection Jesus is just another failed philosopher and leader. His resurrection vindicated his teachings. **We believe in the literal, physical Resurrection of Jesus. Amen!**

Q: Will we be resurrected, too?

A: Yes! Through the power of Christ's resurrection, the just shall rise, the souls shall be reunited with their bodies, and their bodies will be glorified—radically transformed and made superior to their present condition. The bodies of the wicked and "godless" will also rise again in incorruptibility and immortality, but they will not be glorified; rather, these bodies will rise as they had on earth, but more in the sense of an identity rather than an amalgamation of parts at any one time. Traditionally, theology has described the glorified and perfected bodies as having the characteristics of identity, entirety,

and immortality. The bodies of the saints— the faithful in heaven and purgatory— will also have four "transcendent qualities": *impassibility*, or freedom from physical evil, death, sickness, and pain; *clarity*, or freedom from defects and an endowment with beauty and radiance; *agility*, whereby the soul moves the body and there is freedom of motion; and *subtlety*, whereby the body is completely spiritualized under the dominion of the soul. These transcendent qualities actually capture the substance of St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians: what is corrupt rises to incorruption; what is ignoble, to glory; what is weakness, to strength; and what is a natural body, to a spiritual body.

THE SAINTS SPEAK

~ON THE PASSION OF THE LORD~

As there is no Resurrection without first dying, let us look at what some of the greatest saints had to say on the Passion and Death of Christ, as a prelude to the joy of Easter Sunday:

"The Blessed Eucharist is the perfect Sacrament of the Lord's Passion, since It contains Christ Himself and his Passion." -- *St. Thomas Aquinas*

"For when our Lord was suffering upon the cross, the tombs were burst open, the infernal region was disclosed, the souls leapt forth, the dead returned to life, and many of them were seen in Jerusalem, while the mystery of the cross was being perfected; what time our Lord trampled upon death, dissolved the enmity, bound the strong man, and raised the trophy of the cross, His body being lifted up upon it, that the body might appear on high, and death to be depressed under the foot of flesh. Then the heavenly powers wondered, the angels were astonished, the while they looked on this new mystery, and the terrific spectacle which was being enacted in the universe. Yet the entire people, as unconscious of the mystery, exulted over Christ in derision; although the earth was rocking, the mountains, the valleys, and the sea were shaken, and every creature of God was smitten with confusion. The lights of heaven were afraid, the sun fled away, the moon disappeared, the stars withdrew their shining, the day came to end; the angel in astonishment departed from the temple after the rending of the veil, and darkness covered the earth on which its Lord had closed His eyes." *St. Alexander of Alexandria* <http://thecatholicreader.blogspot.com/2013/06/model-your-death-upon-that-of-jesus.html>

~SEPARAR REALIDAD DE LA FICCIÓN~

Al vivir en la sociedad secular y pluralista en la que vivimos, estamos sujetos a muchas opiniones y "hechos" que simplemente no son ciertos. De hecho, a menudo es difícil separar los hechos de la ficción en estos días. ¡Gracias a Dios tenemos la Iglesia para guiarnos y darnos la Verdad con mayúscula! Una ficción, a menudo presentada como un hecho, es la enseñanza de que la Resurrección de Jesús fue simbólica, no literal, y debe verse como un despertar o resurrección espiritual. ¿Por qué es tan importante este punto, la resurrección corporal del Señor? Porque, como los extractos del siguiente artículo del P. Albert J. Hebert, ¡es fundamental para nuestra fe!

**~EL EVENTO MAS IMPORTANTE
DE LA HISTORIA~**

"La Resurrección de Jesucristo fue el punto de inflexión en la historia humana y es la base de la fe cristiana. Completó la obra de salvación y redención del hombre por la que se abrieron de nuevo "las puertas del cielo", cerradas desde el pecado de Adán. La Pasión, muerte y Resurrección de Nuestro Señor constituyen el acontecimiento más trascendental de la historia del mundo. San Pablo lo resumió todo cuando dijo: "Y si Cristo no resucitó, vana es entonces nuestra predicación, y vana es también vuestra fe... Y si Cristo no resucitó, vana es vuestra fe, porque vosotros aún estáis en vuestros pecados". (1 Corintios 15:14, 17). Así, la Resurrección de Cristo es la base de nuestra fe. ~CIERTO, SE LEVANTÓ~

... Aquí, se podría decir, estaba el poder del emperador romano: sus soldados, su sello. Pero, de hecho, había una cosa que todos estos hombres sabían con certeza: estaban custodiando un cuerpo MUERTO. Pero mira! El domingo por la mañana hubo un fuerte terremoto, y el ángel del Señor, semejante a un relámpago con sus vestiduras tan deslumbrantes como la nieve, hizo rodar la piedra y se sentó sobre ella. PREGUNTAS Y RESPUESTAS

~PREGUNTAS SOBRE LA RESURRECCIÓN~

P: ¿Por qué Cristo siguió teniendo evidencia de Sus heridas después de la Resurrección?

R: Tomás de Aquino hizo un excelente resumen de razones: confirmar la fe de los discípulos, interceder con razón por la humanidad, mostrar al Padre lo que había sufrido por la humanidad, demostrar la continuidad del cuerpo anterior y posterior a la Pascua, y mostrar en el último día a todos los humanos "un trofeo eterno de su victoria"

P: ¿Cuáles son algunas de las falacias que la gente cree acerca de la Resurrección del Señor?

R: Algunos abogan por una resurrección espiritual, en cuyo caso, el espíritu de Jesús vivió mientras su cuerpo murió y todavía está muerto. Además de estar en contra del testimonio de las Escrituras y la tradición de la Iglesia, este punto de vista también es anti-creación. Hace que nuestra redención quede fuera del ámbito de la historia y la creación. Otros abogan por una interpretación únicamente metafórica o legendaria de la resurrección. En este caso, la resurrección es solo una historia y no un evento en la historia. En ese caso, todavía no estamos libres de la muerte y el pecado. ¡Todos nosotros moriremos de una muerte no metafórica, así que esperamos una resurrección no metafórica! Otros describen la resurrección de Jesús como las enseñanzas de Jesús que viven en sus seguidores. Sin embargo, sin la resurrección, Jesús es solo otro filósofo y líder fracasado. Su resurrección reivindicó sus enseñanzas. **Creemos en la resurrección literal y física de Jesús. ¡Amén!**

P: ¿Seremos resucitados también?

R: ¡Sí! Por el poder de la resurrección de Cristo, los justos se levantarán, las almas se reunirán con sus cuerpos y sus cuerpos serán glorificados, radicalmente transformados y hechos superiores a su condición actual. Los cuerpos de los malvados e “impíos” también resucitarán en incorruptibilidad e inmortalidad, pero no serán glorificados; más bien, estos cuerpos se levantarán como lo hicieron en la tierra, pero más en el sentido de una identidad que de una amalgama de partes en un momento dado.

Tradicionalmente, la teología ha descrito los cuerpos glorificados y perfeccionados como poseedores de las características de identidad, totalidad, e inmortalidad. Los cuerpos de los santos, los fieles en el cielo y el purgatorio, también tendrán cuatro “cualidades trascendentes”: impasibilidad o libertad del mal físico, la muerte, la enfermedad y el dolor; claridad, o ausencia de defectos y una dotación de belleza y resplandor; la agilidad, por la cual el alma mueve el cuerpo y hay libertad de movimiento; y la sutileza, por la que el cuerpo se espiritualiza por completo bajo el dominio del alma. Estas cualidades trascendentes en realidad capturan la sustancia de la Primera Carta de San Pablo a los Corintios: lo que es corrupto se eleva a la incorrupción; lo que es in-noble, a la gloria; lo que es debilidad, a la fuerza; y lo que es un cuerpo natural, a un cuerpo espiritual.
