SPIRITUAL ACTIVITY

~ASCENSION THURSDAY~

This Thursday, May 26, is Ascension Thursday. This Solemnity is one of the earliest Christian feast days, dating back to the time of the Apostles. According to Holy Scripture, Jesus met many times with His disciples during the 40 days after His resurrection to instruct them on how to carry out His teachings. On the 40th day, He took them to the Mount of Olives, where they watched as He ascended to heaven. For those who attend the Ordinary Form Mass (Mass in English & Spanish), there is NO obligation to attend Mass on Thursday because observation of the feast has been transferred to Sunday, May 29. For those who attend the Latin Mass (Extraordinary Form), there will be a Latin Mass at 5:30 pm on this day.

On Thursday, June 2, there will be a walk along stage #3 of the Camino de Sonoma in honor of the Feast Day of Pope St. Eugene 1. ~LITURGY Q&A~

Why do we sometimes sing two hymns at the end of Mass?
As it is traditional to honor Our Lady at the end of Mass, we'll often include the Marian chant which is specific to the current liturgical season just before the recessional hymn. During Ordinary Time we sing the Salve Regina; in Advent and Christmas, the Alma Redemptoris Mater; in Lent, the Ave Regina Caelorum. As we are now in the Easter Season, we're singing the Regina Caeli, (the familiar prayer replacing the Angelus during Paschaltide): "Queen of Heaven, rejoice, Alleluia, for He whom thou didst merit to bear, Alleluia, hath risen as He said, Alleluia. Pray to God for us, Alleluia."

MY CATHOLIC FAITH

EARLY CHURCH HISTORY

~FROM THE PASTOR~

We see in our first reading from the Book of Acts, that there were many in the early Church who wanted to maintain some of the old practices that had bound the Jews under the Law of Moses, for example, circumcision. (This, in fact, could be categorized as one of the first heresies of the early Church, namely that one had to first become a Jew before becoming a Christian.) I want to focus on the Old Law and why we, as Christians, no longer are bound by it as were the Israelites. Let's take a look at an excerpt from an article by Catholic author, Jim Blackburn:

~NOT BINDING~

"Old Testament law, as such, is not binding on Christians. It never has been. In fact, it was only ever binding on those to whom it was delivered—the Jews (Israelites). That said, some of that law contains elements of a law that is binding on all people of every place and time (natural law) Jesus and Paul provide evidence of this in the New Testament. Matthew's Gospel enlightens us to Jesus' teaching concerning Old Testament law: [A Pharisee lawyer] asked him a question, to test him. "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?" And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the law and the prophets." (Matt. 22:34-40) In saying this, Jesus declared the breadth of the new law of his new covenant which brings to perfection the old law. He explained further to his disciples: "Think not that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets; I have come not to abolish them but to fulfill them. For truly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. Whoever then relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches men so, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but he who does them and teaches them shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven." (Matt. 5:17-19)

~NOT ABOLISHED~

"How could Jesus fulfill the Old Testament law without relaxing it? The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states, "The Law has not been abolished, but rather man is invited to rediscover it in the person of his Master who is its perfect fulfillment" (CCC 2053). A *Catholic Commentary on Holy Scripture* explains, "The solemnity of our Lord's opening pronouncements and his clear intention of inaugurating a new religious movement make it necessary for him to explain his position with regard to the [Old Testament law]. He has not come to abrogate but to bring it to perfection, i.e. to reveal the full intention of the divine legislator. The sense of this "fulfilling" . . . is the total expression of God's will in the old order . . . Far from dying . . . the old moral order is to rise to a new life, infused with a new spirit." (861). THE COMING ASCENSION

~TEACH AND REMIND~

In our Gospel reading today, St. John tells us that, "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." We see here that Jesus assured His apostles that His coming ascension would not mean the end of their learning but that there was more to be learned and more to unfold. This brings to mind papal infallibility. In sending us the Holy Spirit after His ascension into heaven, Jesus was assuring us that He would always be with His Church to guide it and protect it. How is this accomplished? Let's take a look at the following article:

~SPECIAL CHARISM~

"It is the Holy Spirit who prevents the pope from officially teaching error, and this charism follows necessarily from the existence of the Church itself. If, as Christ promised, the gates of hell will not prevail against the Church then it must be protected from fundamentally falling into error and thus away from Christ. It must prove itself to be a perfectly steady guide in matters pertaining to salvation. Of course, infallibility does not include a guarantee that any particular pope won't "neglect" to teach the truth, or that

mere disciplinary decisions will be intelligently made. **When he is speaking on matters of faith and morals and intends to instruct the whole Church by defining a doctrine, however, the Church believes that he is protected by the Holy Spirit and cannot speak in error.** We must have a perfectly steady rock to build upon and to trust as the source of solemn Christian teaching. And that's why papal infallibility exists. Since Christ said the gates of hell would not prevail against his Church (Matt. 16:18b), this means that his Church can never pass out of existence. But if the Church ever apostatized by teaching heresy, then it would cease to exist; because it would cease to be Jesus' Church. Thus the Church *cannot* teach heresy, meaning that anything it solemnly defines for the faithful to believe is true. This same reality is reflected in the Apostle Paul's statement that the Church is "the pillar and foundation of the truth" (1 Tim. 3:15). If the Church is the foundation of religious truth in this world, then it is God's own spokesman. As Christ told his disciples: "He who hears you hears me, and he who rejects you rejects me, and he who rejects me rejects him who sent me" (Luke 10:16). MI FE CATOLICA

**HISTORIA DE LA IGLESIA PRIMITIVA
~DEL PASTOR~**

Vemos en nuestra primera lectura del Libro de los Hechos, que había muchos en la Iglesia primitiva que querían mantener algunas de las antiguas prácticas que habían atado a los judíos bajo la Ley de Moisés, por ejemplo, la circuncisión. (Esto, de hecho, podría clasificarse como una de las primeras herejías de la Iglesia primitiva, es decir, que uno tenía que convertirse primero en judío antes de convertirse en cristiano). Quiero centrarme en la Ley antigua y por qué nosotros, como cristianos, ya no estamos atados por ella como los israelitas. Echemos un vistazo a un extracto de un artículo del autor católico, Jim Blackburn:

~NO VINCULANTE~

“La ley del Antiguo Testamento, como tal, no es vinculante para los cristianos. Nunca lo ha sido. De hecho, solo obligaba a aquellos a quienes se les entregaba: los judíos (israelitas). Dicho esto, parte de esa ley contiene elementos de una ley que es vinculante para todas las personas de todo lugar y tiempo (ley natural). Jesús y Pablo brindan evidencia de esto en el Nuevo Testamento. El Evangelio de Mateo nos ilumina sobre la enseñanza de Jesús sobre la ley del Antiguo Testamento: [Un abogado fariseo] le hizo una pregunta para ponerlo a prueba. "Maestro, ¿cuál es el gran mandamiento en la ley?" Y él le dijo: Amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, y con toda tu alma, y con toda tu mente. Este es el primero y grande mandamiento. Y el segundo es semejante: Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. De estos dos mandamientos depende toda la ley y los profetas. (Mat. 22:34-40) Al decir esto, Jesús declaró la amplitud de la nueva ley de su nuevo pacto que lleva a la perfección la antigua ley. Explicó además a sus discípulos: “No penséis que he venido a abolir la ley y los profetas; No he venido a abrogarlas sino a cumplirlas. Porque de cierto os digo que hasta que pasen el cielo y la tierra, ni una jota, ni una tilde pasará de la ley, hasta que todo se haya cumplido. Cualquiera, pues, que se relaje en uno de estos pequeños mandamientos y así enseñe a los hombres, muy pequeño será llamado en el reino de los cielos; mas el que las haga y las enseñe, éste será llamado grande en el reino de los cielos.” (Mateo 5:17-19)

~NO ABOLIDO~

“¿Cómo podría Jesús cumplir la ley del Antiguo Testamento sin relajarla? El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica afirma: "La Ley no ha sido abolida, sino que el hombre está invitado a redescubrirla en la persona de su Maestro que es su cumplimiento perfecto" (CCC 2053). Un Comentario Católico sobre la Sagrada Escritura explica: La solemnidad de los pronunciamientos iniciales de nuestro Señor y su clara intención de inaugurar un nuevo movimiento religioso hacen necesario que él explique su posición con respecto a la [ley del Antiguo Testamento]. No ha venido a abolirla sino a perfeccionarla, es decir, a revelar la plena intención del legislador divino. El sentido de este "cumplir". . . es la expresión total de la voluntad de Dios en el antiguo orden. . . Lejos de morir. . . el viejo orden moral es resucitar a una nueva vida, infundido con un nuevo espíritu.” (861).

LA PRÓXIMA ASCENSIÓN

~ ENSEÑAR Y RECORDAR ~

En nuestra lectura del Evangelio de hoy, San Juan nos dice que “El Abogado, el Espíritu Santo, a quien el Padre enviará en mi nombre, les enseñará todo y les recordará todo lo que les dije”. Vemos aquí que Jesús aseguró a sus apóstoles que su próxima ascensión no significaría el final de su aprendizaje, sino que había más que aprender y más que desarrollar. Esto trae a la mente la infalibilidad papal. Al enviarnos el Espíritu Santo después de Su ascensión al cielo, Jesús nos estaba asegurando que Él siempre estaría con Su Iglesia para guiarla y protegerla. ¿Cómo se logra esto? Echemos un vistazo al siguiente artículo:

~CARISMA ESPECIAL~

“Es el Espíritu Santo quien impide que el Papa enseñe oficialmente el error, y este carisma se sigue necesariamente de la existencia de la Iglesia misma. Si, como Cristo prometió, las puertas del infierno no prevalecerán contra la Iglesia, entonces debe ser protegida de caer fundamentalmente en el error y, por lo tanto, de alejarse de Cristo. Debe demostrar que es una guía perfectamente firme en asuntos relacionados con la salvación. Por supuesto, la infalibilidad no incluye una garantía de que ningún Papa en particular "descuidará" enseñar la verdad, →

o que estará libre de pecado, o que las meras decisiones disciplinarias se tomarán inteligentemente. Sin embargo, cuando habla sobre cuestiones de fe y moral y pretende instruir a toda la Iglesia definiendo una doctrina, la Iglesia cree que está protegida por el Espíritu Santo y no puede hablar en error. Debemos tener una roca perfectamente firme sobre la cual construir y confiar como la fuente de la enseñanza cristiana solemne. Y es por eso que existe la infalibilidad papal. Dado que Cristo dijo que las puertas del infierno no prevalecerían contra su Iglesia (Mat. 16:18b), esto significa que su Iglesia nunca dejará de existir. Pero si la Iglesia alguna vez apostatará enseñando herejías, entonces dejaría de existir; porque dejaría de ser la Iglesia de Jesús. Por lo tanto, la Iglesia no puede enseñar la herejía, lo que significa que cualquier cosa que defina solemnemente para que los fieles creen es verdad. Como dijo Cristo a sus discípulos: "El que a vosotros oye, a mí me oye; y el que a vosotros rechaza, a mí me rechaza; y el que me rechaza a mí, rechaza al que me envió" (Lc 10,16).
