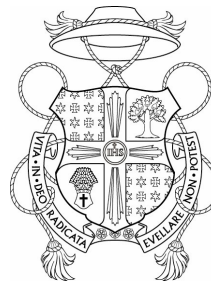
~GOLDEN OPPORTUNITIES~

MY CATHOLIC FAITH

WHY DO WE DIE?

~GOD AND DEATH~

[This week's reflections are taken from our June 28, 2015 bulletin.] Today's readings remind us of something that we will all have to face one day: death. In our first reading, from the book of Wisdom, we read: "God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living. ... But by the envy of the devil, death entered the world, and they who belong to his company experience it." We also read about Jesus raising a little girl, the daughter of Jairus, from the dead in our Gospel reading. If there was no death when God finished His creation and pronounced it very good, why do we die now? We see death all around us today. Something must have happened to change creation—that something was sin. Let's take a look at the Catechism of the Catholic Church about how sin entered the world, a brought with it, death.

HOW DEATH ENTERED THE WORLD

~THE FALL~

According to Church teaching, in an event known as the "fall of the angels" a number of angels chose

to rebel against God and his reign. The leader of this rebellion has been given many names including "Lucifer" (meaning "light bearer" in Latin), "Satan" and the devil. The sin of pride, considered one of seven deadly sins, is attributed to Satan for desiring to be God's equal. A fallen angel tempted the first humans, Adam and Eve, who then committed the original sin which brought suffering and death into the world. This event, known as the Fall of Man, left humans separated from their original state of intimacy with God, a separation that can persist beyond death. The *Catechism* states that: "The account of the fall in Genesis 3 uses figurative language, but affirms a primeval event, a deed that took place at the beginning of the history of man. ... —From paragraph 390 of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*."



~ORIGINAL SIN~

"... original sin does not have the character of a personal fault in any of Adam's descendants. It is a deprivation of original holiness and justice, but human nature has not been totally corrupted: it is wounded in the natural powers proper to it, subject to ignorance, suffering and the dominion of death, and inclined to sin—an inclination to evil that is called concupiscence." – From paragraph 405 of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

~CATHOLIC Q & A~

Q: Where did people who died before Christ go?

A: According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, before the Resurrection, Abraham, Noah, Moses, Adam and Eve, and all the righteous were in the Limbo of the Fathers (*limbus patrum*) where they remained until "in his human soul united to his divine person, the dead Christ went down to the realm of the dead. He opened heaven's gates for the just who had gone before him" (CCC 637).

Q: Buried in the middle of the Apostles' Creed is a profound mystery of the Christian faith, the affirmation that Christ 'descended into hell.' Did Jesus really go to hell? How can it be possible for God Incarnate to experience hell?

A: Some Latin clarifies matters. In Latin, the word translated as *hell* in English is *inferna*. In the ancient world, this word had the generic meaning of *underworld*, not *hell* specifically. In the *Vulgate* it is used to translate a number of different Hebrew and Greek words from Scripture. Two Greek words are especially important here: *hades* and *gehenna*. *Hades*, which is the Greek translation of the Hebrew *sheol*, is the biblical term for where righteous Israelites went who died before Christ. *Gehenna*, on the other hand, is the destination of the damned. It is to *hades*—better known to Catholics as the Limbo of the Fathers—that Christ descended, Church tradition says. But, significantly, the power of His presence was nonetheless felt in the farthest reaches of hell, according to Aquinas. Excerpted from: *Did Jesus Really go to Hell?*, By: Stephen Beale

GREAT SAINTS RAISE THE DEAD

~SAINT FRANCIS XAVIER~

"On the Fishery Coast, St. Francis Xavier worked enough miracles to fill a large volume. Once when he was about to begin Mass in a small church at Combutur, a crowd entered with the corpse of a boy who had been drowned in a well. His mother threw herself at the feet of St. Francis, who was also the one who had baptized this child. She implored him to restore the boy to life. Francis said a short prayer, took the dead child by the hand, and bade him arise. The child rose and immediately ran to his mother." Among his later miracles, Francis raised to life a young pagan woman "of some quality" who had been dead a whole day. ~SAINT MARTIN OF TOURS~

"... not long after St. Martin established a monastery in Ligugé, a catechumen joined the monks in Ligugé for instruction in the faith. While St. Martin was away traveling for three days, the unbaptised catechumen came down with a high fever and died. His body lay lifeless in one of the cells, awaiting burial.

Martin, stretched himself at full length on the dead limbs of his departed brother. After he had stayed lying there some time in prayer, and had become a w a r e



through the Spirit that the power of God was present, he rose up for a short time, and fixing his gaze on the dead man's face he waited with confidence for the result of his prayer and the mercy of the Lord. And after scarcely two hours had passed he saw the dead man begin to move all his limbs little by little, and his eyes trembling and blinking as he recovered his sight. POR QUE MORIOMOS

~ DIOS Y MUERTE ~

[Las reflexiones de esta semana están tomadas de nuestro boletín del 28 de junio de 2015.] Las lecturas de hoy nos recuerdan algo que todos tendremos que enfrentar un día: la muerte. En nuestra primera lectura, del libro de la Sabiduría, leemos: "Dios no hizo la muerte, ni se regocija en la destrucción de los vivos. ... Pero por la envidia del diablo, la muerte entró en el mundo, y los que pertenecen a su compañía la experimentan ". También leemos sobre Jesús resucitando a una niña, la hija de Jairo, de entre los muertos en nuestra lectura del Evangelio. Si no hubo muerte cuando Dios terminó Su creación y la declaró muy buena, ¿por qué morimos ahora? Hoy vemos la muerte a nuestro alrededor. Algo debe haber sucedido para cambiar la creación, ese algo era pecado. Echemos un vistazo al Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica sobre cómo el pecado entró en el mundo y trajo consigo la muerte.

COMO ENTRO LA MUERTE AL MUNDO



~ LA CAÍDA ~

Según las enseñanzas de la Iglesia, en un evento conocido como la "caída de los ángeles", varios ángeles decidieron rebelarse contra Dios y su reino. Al líder de esta rebelión se le han dado muchos nombres, incluidos "Lucifer" (que significa "portador de la luz" en latín), "Satanás" y el diablo. El pecado del orgullo, considerado uno de los siete pecados capitales, se atribuye a Satanás por desear ser igual a Dios. Un ángel caído tentó a los primeros humanos, Adán y Eva, quienes luego cometieron el pecado original que trajo sufrimiento y muerte al mundo. Este evento, conocido como la Caída del Hombre, dejó a los humanos separados de su estado original de intimidad con Dios, una separación que puede persistir más allá de la muerte. El Catecismo dice que: "El relato de la caída en Génesis 3 usa lenguaje figurativo, pero afirma un evento primordial, un hecho que tuvo lugar al comienzo de la historia del hombre. ... —Del párrafo 390 del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica.

~ PECADO ORIGINAL ~

"... el pecado original no tiene el carácter de falta personal en ninguno de los descendientes de Adán. Es una privación de la santidad y la justicia originales, pero la naturaleza humana no ha sido totalmente corrompida: está herida en los poderes naturales que le son propios, sujeta a la ignorancia, al sufrimiento y al dominio de la muerte, e inclinada al pecado, una inclinación al mal. eso se llama concupiscencia." - Del párrafo 405 del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica

PREGUNTAS Y RESPUESTAS

~ PREGUNTAS Y RESPUESTAS CATÓLICAS ~

P: ¿A dónde fueron las personas que murieron antes de Cristo?

R: Según el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, antes de la Resurrección, Abraham, Noé, Moisés, Adán y Eva, y todos los justos estaban en el Limbo de los Padres (limbus patrum) donde permanecieron hasta que "en su alma humana se unieron a su persona divina, Cristo muerto descendió al reino de los muertos. Abrió las puertas del cielo a los justos que habían ido antes que él "(CIC 637).

P: En el Credo de los Apóstoles hay un misterio profundo de la fe cristiana, la afirmación de que Cristo "descendió a los infiernos". ¿Jesús realmente fue al infierno? ¿Cómo es posible que Dios Encarnado experimente el infierno?

R: Un poco de latín aclara las cosas. En latín, la palabra traducida como infierno. En el mundo antiguo, esta palabra tenía el significado genérico de inframundo, no infierno específicamente. En la Vulgata se usa para traducir varias palabras hebreas y griegas diferentes de las Escrituras. Dos palabras griegas son especialmente importantes aquí: hades y gehenna. Hades, que es la traducción griega del hebreo sheol, es el término bíblico para el lugar adonde fueron los Israelitas justos que murieron antes de Cristo. Gehenna, por otro lado, es el destino de los condenados. Es al Hades, mejor conocido por los católicos como el Limbo de los Padres, donde Cristo descendió, dice la tradición de la Iglesia. Pero, de manera significativa, el poder de Su presencia se sintió no obstante en los confines más lejanos del infierno, según Tomás de Aquino. GRANDES SANTOS QUE RESUCITABAN A LOS MUERTOS

~ SAN FRANCISCO JAVIER ~

"En Fishery Coast, San Francisco Javier realizó suficientes milagros para llenar un gran volumen. Una vez, cuando estaba a punto de comenzar la Misa en una pequeña iglesia de Combutur, entró una multitud con el cadáver de un niño que se había ahogado en un pozo. Su madre se arrojó a los pies de San Francisco, que era también quien había bautizado a este niño. Ella le imploró que devolviera la vida al niño. Francisco dijo una breve oración, tomó al niño muerto de la mano y le pidió que se levantara. El niño se levantó e inmediatamente corrió hacia su madre ". Entre sus milagros posteriores, Francisco resucitó a una joven pagana "de cierta calidad" que había estado muerta un día entero. ~ SAN MARTÍN DE TOURS ~

"... Poco después de que San Martín estableciera un monasterio en Ligugé, un catecúmeno se unió a los monjes en Ligugé para recibir instrucción en la fe. Mientras San Martín estaba viajando durante tres días, el catecúmeno no bautizado sufrió una fiebre alta y murió. Su cuerpo yacía sin vida en una de las celdas, esperando ser enterrado. Martín, se estiró completamente sobre las extremidades muertas de su hermano fallecido.
