



MY CATHOLIC FAITH

THE TRANSFIGURATION

~FROM THE PASTOR~

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. According to St. Thomas Aquinas, "the Transfiguration occurred because the divine glory which was Christ's was allowed for a moment to shine through His human body. He did this so that they could taste for a short time the contemplation of eternal joy, in view of the persecutions they would suffer." Let's look at this a bit more closely with the following articles.

WHAT IT WAS

~HIS GLORY SHONE FORTH~

In both the Gospels of St. Matthew and St. Mark, the account of the Transfiguration immediately follows Jesus' prediction of His passion and His stating the arduous demands of discipleship (see Mt 16:21-28; Mk 8:31-38). We may assume that the Transfiguration not only clearly revealed Jesus' divinity for a moment. He also allowed His glory to shine forth for the encouragement of the key apostles who were present: Peter, James and John. Like so many incidents in Jesus' earthly ministry, the Transfiguration was foreshad-owed in the Old Testament. In this case, the type (the foreshadowing) is God's revelation of himself to Moses on Mount Sinai. The "Ignatius Catholic Study Bible (Gospel of Matthew)" lists several parallels between the two epiphanies as recorded in Exodus and in St. Matthew's Gospel.

- Each takes place on a mountain (see Ex 24:13 and Mt 17:1).
- Each occurs on a sev-enth day (Ex 24:16 and Mt 17:1).
- Each shows forth the glory of God's presence.
- Each reports God speaking through a cloud (Ex 24:16 and Mt 17:5).

Moses and Elijah are the key representa-tives of the Law and the prophets. Their coming to talk with Jesus shows Him to be the fulfillment of God's revelation to them. Only Luke specifies the subject of their conversation with Jesus. Moses and Elijah "spoke of his [Jesus'] exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem" (Lk 9:31). Note the word "accomplish." It was important for the apostles to know that Jesus did not simply endure His passion; He accomplished it, by totally submitting him-self to it. A final note: Peter proposed building three booths, one each for Jesus, Moses and Elijah. He may have wished to extend their stay on the Mount of Transfiguration. But St. Mark, who was Peter's protégé, simply tells us that Peter blurted out this proposal because "he hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified" (9:6). By Fr. ~AQUINAS SPEAKS~

"...Our Lord, after foretelling His Passion to His disciples, had exhorted them to follow the path of His sufferings (Matthew 16:21-24). Now in order that anyone go straight along a road, he must have some knowledge of the end: thus an archer will not shoot the arrow straight unless he first see the target. Hence Thomas said (John 14:5): 'Lord, we know not whither Thou goest; and how can we know the way?' Above all is this necessary when hard and rough is the road, heavy the going, but delightful the end. Now by His Passion Christ achieved glory, not only of His soul, not only of His soul, which He had from the first moment of His conception, but also of His body; according to Luke (24:26): 'Christ ought [Vulgate: 'ought not Christ'] to have suffered these things, and so to enter into His glory (?).' To which glory He brings those who follow the footsteps of His Passion, according to Acts 14:21: 'Through many tribulations we must enter into the kingdom of God.' Therefore it was fitting that He should show His disciples the glory of His clarity (which is to be transfigured), to which He will configure those who are His; according to Philippians 3:21: '(Who) will reform the body of our lowness configured [Douay: 'made like'] to the body of His glory.' Hence Bede says on Mark 8:39: 'By His loving foresight He allowed them to taste for a short time the contemplation of eternal joy, so that they might bear persecution bravely.'" CATEDRAL DE ST. EUGENE'S — 6 de Agosto del 2023 La Transfiguración del Señor

LA TRANSFIGURACION

~DEL PÁRROCO~

Hoy celebramos la fiesta de la Transfiguración del Señor. Según Santo Tomás de Aquino, "la Transfiguración tuvo lugar porque se permitió que la gloria divina que era de Cristo brillara por un momento a través de su cuerpo humano. Lo hizo para que pudieran gustar por un breve tiempo la contemplación de la alegría eterna, en vista de las persecuciones que sufrirían." Veamos esto un poco más de cerca con los siguientes artículos.

LO QUE FUE

~SU GLORIA RESPLANDECIÓ~

Tanto en el Evangelio de San Mateo como en el de San Marcos, el relato de la Transfiguración sigue inmediatamente a la predicción de la pasión de Jesús y a su declaración de las arduas exigencias del discipulado (véanse Mt 16:21-28; Mc 8:31-38). Podemos suponer que la Transfiguración no sólo reveló claramente la divinidad de Jesús por un momento. También permitió que resplandeciera Su gloria para aliento de los apóstoles clave que estaban presentes: Pedro, Santiago y Juan. Como tantos otros incidentes del ministerio terrenal de Jesús, la Transfiguración fue prefigurada en el Antiguo Testamento. En este caso, el tipo (la prefiguración) es la revelación de Dios a Moisés en el monte Sinaí. La "Ignatius Catholic Study Bible (Gospel of Matthew)" enumera varios paralelismos entre las dos epifanías registradas en el Éxodo y en el Evangelio de San Mateo.

- Cada una tiene lugar en una montaña (ver Ex 24:13 y Mt 17:1).
- Cada una ocurre en un séptimo día (Ex 24:16 y Mt 17:1).
- Todos muestran la gloria de la presencia de Dios.
- Cada uno informa de que Dios habla a través de una nube (Ex 24:16 y Mt 17:5).

Moisés y Elías son los principales representantes de la Ley y los profetas. Su venida para hablar con \rightarrow

Jesús lo muestra como el cumplimiento de la revelación que Dios les había hecho. Sólo Lucas especifica el tema de su conversación con Jesús. Moisés y Elías "hablaron de su éxodo [el de Jesús] que iba a cumplir en Jerusalén" (Lc 9,31). Nótese la palabra "cumplir". Era importante que los apóstoles supieran que Jesús no se limitó a soportar su pasión; la cumplió, sometiéndose totalmente a ella. Una nota final: Pedro propuso construir tres cabañas, una para Jesús, otra para Moisés y otra para Elías. Es posible que quisiera prolongar su estancia en el Monte de la Transfiguración. Pero San Marcos, que era el protegido de Pedro, nos dice simplemente que Pedro soltó esta propuesta porque "apenas sabía qué decir, estaban tan aterrorizados" (9:6). ~SANTO TOMAS DE AQUINO HABLA~

'...Nuestro Señor, después de predecir Su Pasión a Sus discípulos, les había exhortado a seguir el camino de Sus sufrimientos (Mateo 16:21-24). Ahora bien, para que alguien vaya recto por un camino, debe tener algún conocimiento del fin: así, un arquero no lanzará la flecha recta si antes no ve el blanco. De ahí que Tomás dijera (Jn 14,5): "Señor, no sabemos a dónde vas; ¿y cómo podemos saber el camino?". Y esto es necesario, sobre todo, cuando el camino es duro y áspero, y la marcha pesada, pero el fin delicioso. Ahora bien, por Su Pasión Cristo alcanzó la gloria, no sólo de Su alma, que la tuvo desde el primer momento de Su concepción, sino también de Su cuerpo; según Lucas (24:26): Cristo debió [Vulgata: 'no debió Cristo'] haber padecido estas cosas, y así entrar en su gloria (...)'. A cuya gloria lleva a los que siguen las huellas de su Pasión, según Hechos 14:21: 'A través de muchas tribulaciones debemos entrar en el reino de Dios.' Por tanto, era conve niente que mostrara a sus discípulos la gloria de su claridad (que ha de transfigurarse), a la que configurará a los que son suyos; según Filipenses 3:21: (Quien) reformará el cuerpo de nuestra bajeza configurado [Douay: 'hecho semejante'] al cuerpo de su gloria.' De ahí que Beda diga sobre Marcos 8:39: '*Por* su amorosa previsión les permitió gustar por poco tiempo la contemplación del gozo eterno, para que soportaran con valentía la persecución'".
