MY CATHOLIC FAITH



THE SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

~FROM THE PASTOR~

I ran the following article way back in 2016 for Divine Mercy Sunday. I'm running it again because it gives a great synopsis of the origin of this day and also interesting information about the Sunday that used to be known as "Low Sunday". Low Sunday is still celebrated here at the Cathedral, for we also celebrate Mass in the Extraordinary Form, which uses the 1962 Missal. So, whichever Mass you attend, you now hopefully will have a fuller understanding of the history behind each.

~DIVINE MERCY~

Let's look at the origin of this relatively new Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday: "During the course of Jesus' revelations to Saint Faustina on the Divine Mercy, He asked on numerous occasions that a feast day be dedicated to the Divine Mercy and that this feast be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. The liturgical texts of that day, the 2nd Sunday of Easter, concern the institution of the Sacrament of Penance, the Tribunal of the Divine Mercy, and are thus already suited to the request of Our Lord. This Feast, which had already been granted to the nation of Poland and been celebrated within Vatican City, was granted to the Universal Church by Pope John Paul II on the occasion of the canonization of Sr. Faustina on 30 April 2000. In a decree dated 23 May 2000, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments stated that "throughout the world the Second Sunday of Easter will receive the name

Divine Mercy Sunday, a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come." These papal acts represent the highest endorsement that the Church can give to a private revelation, an act of papal infallibility proclaiming the certain sanctity of the mystic, and the granting of a universal feast, as requested by Our Lord to St. Faustina." <https://www.ewtn.com/devotionals/mercy/feast.htm>

~LOW SUNDAY~

Before this new Feast came into being, the second Sunday after Easter had been known as Low Sunday. As the Catholic Encyclopedia explains, "the origin of the name (Low Sunday) is uncertain, but it is apparently intended to indicate the contrast between it and the great Easter festival immediately preceding, and also, perhaps, to signify that, being the Octave Day of Easter, it was considered part of that feast, though in a lower degree. Low Sunday has two names assigned to it in the Liturgy: Quasimodo, from the first word of the Introit; and Sunday in albis (or, more explicitly, in albis depositis), because on this day the neophytes assisted at the Church services attired in their ordinary dress. In the Middle Ages it was called Close-Pasch, no doubt in allusion to its being the last day of the Easter Octave. Such is the solemnity of this Sunday that not only is it of Greater Double rite, but no feast, however great, can ever be kept upon it." Taken from Dom Gueranger's "The Liturgical Year"

~SR. MARIA FAUSTINA~

Now that we know a bit more about this very special Sunday, let's take a look at some of the writings that are found in the diary of Sr. Maria Faustina on the topic of the mercy of the Lord and this Feast Day of Mercy: "On one occasion, I heard these words: *My daughter, tell the whole world about My Inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.** [our emphasis] *On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy Emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy."* (Diary 699) "Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to our neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to absolve yourself from it." (Diary 742) As you can see, the Lord's desire for the Feast includes the solemn, public veneration of the Image of Divine Mercy by the Church, as well as personal acts of veneration and mercy. The great promise for the individual soul is that a devotional act of sacramental penance and Communion will obtain for that soul the plenitude of the divine mercy on the Feast. The Cardinal of Krakow, Cardinal Macharski, whose diocese is the center of the spread of the devotion and the sponsor of the Cause of Sr. Faustina, has written that we should use Lent as preparation for the Feast and confess even before Holy Week! So, it is clear that the confessional requirement does not have to be met on the Feast itself. That would be an impossible burden for the clergy if it did. The Communion requirement is easily met that day, however, since it is a day of obligation, being Sunday. We would only need confession again, if received earlier in Lenten or Easter Season, if we were in the state of mortal sin on the Feast." <http://www.marian.org/>.

INTERESTING FACTS

~PLENARY INDULGENCE~

Today, a plenary indulgence is granted to those who, under the usual conditions, take part in the public devotion to His Divine Mercy or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (in the tabernacle or exposed), recite the Our Father, the Creed, and a prayer to Jesus appealing to His mercy.

~THE HUNCHBACK OF NOTRE DAME~

Yes, the name of today's Feast in the Old Calendar (Quasimodo Sunday) is the origin of the name of the hunchback, Quasimodo, in Victor Hugo's "The Hunchback of Notre Dame." Poor Quasimodo was a foundling who was discovered at the cathedral on Low Sunday and so was named for the Feast.

~STRANGE CUSTOM~

In England, at one time, on the Monday after Low Sunday, between the hours of 9 and noon, there was the strange custom by which men "captured" women for a ransom which was given to the Church. On Tuesday the women reciprocate by capturing the men. These two days became known as "Hocktide."

~SAINTLY QUOTE~

"When the just man falls he shall not be overthrown, because the Lord will stretch out His hand. These thoughts, dearly-beloved, must be kept in mind not only for the Easter festival, but also for the sanctification of the whole life, and to this our present exercise ought to be directed, that what has delighted the souls of the faithful by the experience of a short observance may pass into a habit and remain unalterably, and if any fault creep in, it may be destroyed by speedy repentance. ... so that rising ever anew from all downfalls, we may deserve to attain to the incorruptible Resurrection of our glorified flesh in Christ Jesus our Lord, Who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Ghost for ever and ever. Amen." — Pope St. Leo the Great

DOMINGO DESPUES DE PASCUA

~DEL PASTOR~

Publiqué el siguiente artículo en 2016 para el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Lo vuelvo a publicar porque da una gran sinopsis del origen de este día y también información interesante sobre el domingo que solía ser conocido como "Domingo Bajo". El domingo bajo todavía se celebra aquí en la Catedral, porque también celebramos la Misa en la Forma Extraordinaria, que usa el Misal de 1962. Entonces, cualquiera que sea la Misa a la que asista, ahora con suerte tendrá una comprensión más completa de la historia detrás de cada una.

~DIVINA MISERICORDIA~

Miremos el origen de esta relativamente nueva Fiesta del Domingo de la Divina Misericordia: "Durante el curso de las revelaciones de Jesús a Santa Faustina sobre la Divina Misericordia, Él pidió en numerosas ocasiones que se dedicara una fiesta a la Divina Misericordia y que esta fiesta se celebrase el domingo después de Pascua. Los textos litúrgicos de ese día, el segundo domingo de Pascua, se refieren a la institución del Sacramento de la Penitencia, el Tribunal de la Divina Misericordia, y por lo tanto ya se adaptan a la petición de Nuestro Señor. Esta Fiesta, que ya había sido concedida a la nación de Polonia y celebrada en la Ciudad del Vaticano, fue concedida a la Iglesia Universal por el Papa Juan Pablo II con motivo de la canonización de Sor Faustina el 30 de abril de 2000. En un decreto fechado El 23 de mayo de 2000, la Congregación para el Culto Divino y la Disciplina de los Sacramentos afirmó que "en todo el mundo el segundo domingo de Pascua recibirá el nombre de Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, invitación perenne al mundo cristiano a afrontar, con confianza en la benevolencia divina, las dificultades y pruebas que la humanidad experimentará en los años venideros". Estos actos papales representan el más alto respaldo que la Iglesia puede dar a una revelación privada, un acto de infalibilidad papal que proclama la santidad cierta del místico y la concesión de una fiesta universal, como lo pidió Nuestro Señor a Santa Faustina".

~DOMINGO BAJO~

Antes de que existiera esta nueva Fiesta, el segundo domingo después de Pascua se conocía como Domingo Bajo.

Como explica la Enciclopedia Católica, "el origen del nombre (Domingo Bajo) es incierto, pero es aparentemente tenía la intención de indicar el contraste entre ella y la gran fiesta de Pascua inmediatamente anterior, y también, quizás, significar que, siendo el Día de la Octava de Pascua, se consideraba parte de esa fiesta, aunque en menor grado. El domingo bajo tiene asignados dos nombres en la liturgia: Quasimodo, de la primera palabra del Introito; y el domingo in albis (o, más explícitamente, in albis depositis), porque en este día los neófitos asistían a los servicios de la Iglesia ataviados con su traje ordinario. En la Edad Media se llamaba Pascua de Clausura, sin duda en alusión a que era el último día de la Octava Pascual. Tal es la solemnidad de este domingo que no sólo es de doble rito mayor, sino que ninguna fiesta, por grande que sea, puede celebrarse en él".

~SR. MARIA FAUSTINA~

Ahora que sabemos un poco más sobre este domingo tan especial, echemos un vistazo a algunos de los escritos que se encuentran en el diario de Sor María Faustina sobre el tema de la misericordia del Señor y esta Fiesta de la Misericordia: "En una ocasión escuché estas palabras: Hija Mía, habla al mundo entero de Mi Inconcebible Misericordia. Deseo que la Fiesta de la Misericordia sea refugio y amparo para todas las almas, y especialmente para los pobres pecadores. En ese día se abren las profundidades mismas de Mi tierna misericordia. Derramo todo un océano de gracias sobre aquellas almas que se acercan a la fuente de Mi misericordia. **El alma que se confesará y recibirá la Sagrada Comunión obtendrá el completo perdón de los pecados y de las penas.** *[énfasis nuestro] Ese día se abren todas las compuertas divinas por las que fluye la gracia. Que ningún alma tema acercarse a Mí, aunque sus pecados sean negros como la noche. Mi misericordia es tan grande que ninguna mente, sea de hombre o de ángel, podrá sondearla por toda la eternidad. Todo lo que existe ha salido de lo más profundo de Mi tierna misericordia. Cada alma en su relación Conmigo contemplará Mi amor y Misericordia por toda la eternidad. La Fiesta de la Misericordia surgió de Mis profundidades de ternura. Es Mi deseo que se celebre solemnemente el primer domingo después de Pascua. La humanidad no tendrá paz hasta que se vuelva a la Fuente de Mi Misericordia. (Diario 699)

~MISERICORDIA POR NUESTRO PRÓJIMO~

“Sí, el primer domingo después de Pascua es la Fiesta de la Misericordia, pero también deben haber obras de misericordia, que deben surgir del amor a Mí. Debes mostrar misericordia a nuestros vecinos siempre y en todas partes. No debes encogerte ante esto o tratar de absolvete de ello. (Diario 742)

~VENERACIÓN PÚBLICA~

“Como podéis ver, el deseo del Señor para la Fiesta incluye la veneración solemne y pública de la Imagen de la Divina Misericordia por parte de la Iglesia, así como actos personales de veneración y misericordia. La gran promesa para el alma individual es que un acto devocional de penitencia sacramental y Comunión obtendrá para esa alma la plenitud de la misericordia divina en la Fiesta.

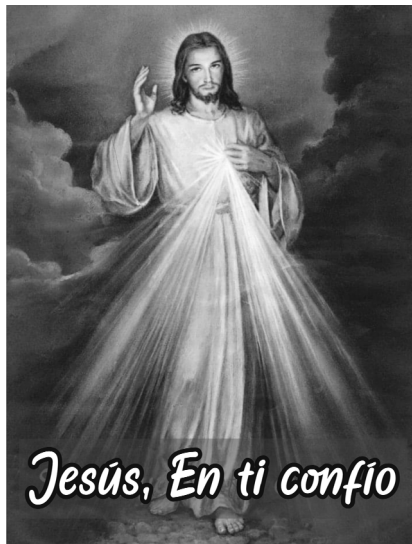
~REQUISITO DE CONFESIÓN~

*El Cardenal de Cracovia, el Cardenal Macharski, cuya diócesis es el centro de la difusión de la devoción y el patrocinador de la Causa de Sor Faustina, ha escrito que debemos usar la Cuaresma como preparación para la Fiesta y confesar incluso antes de la Semana Santa. Entonces, está claro que el requisito confesional no tiene que cumplirse en la Fiesta misma. Eso sería una carga imposible para el clero si lo hiciera. Sin embargo, el requisito de la Comunión se cumple fácilmente ese día, ya que es un día de obligación, siendo domingo. Solo necesitaríamos la confesión nuevamente, si la recibimos antes en la Cuaresma o en la Temporada de Pascua, si estuviéramos en estado de pecado mortal en la Fiesta”.
