MY CATHOLIC FAITH

GREED & ETERNITY

~FROM THE PASTOR~

Our readings today speak about greed. What exactly is greed? Greed is a selfish and excessive desire for more of something (such as money or possessions). The key words in this definition are “selfish” and “excessive”. Christians often struggle with the notion of greed in that they want to provide well for their families but do not want to commit this particular sin in the pursuit of this goal. Of course, there is nothing wrong with working hard with the goal of a larger home as the family grows or starting college funds for the children. As responsible parents, these things are good in and of themselves. The danger zone, of course, is if this goal becomes an obsession, causing stress and ultimately, lack of trust in God’s love and holy will. We see in our first reading, “For what profit comes to man from all the toil and anxiety of heart ...? “Then, St. Paul tells us in our second reading to, “Put to death, then, the parts of you that are earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry.” And finally, St. Luke records Jesus as saying, “Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one’s life does not consist of possessions.” And He tells us that when death comes suddenly to those who have stored up riches for what they think will be a glorious future, their greed will condemn them. (“Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God.”) There’s a lot to unpack here, including our Responsorial Psalm which tells us not to harden our hearts against God. A hard heart is a stubborn heart, a proud heart. The only way to combat a hard heart is with humility, for it is humility which opens our hearts to grace. Pride, like greed, is idolatry, for one makes an idol of oneself, i.e., I become my own god, knowing what is right or wrong, etc. We see this quite blatantly with Catholic politicians who hold beliefs that are diametrically opposed to the Catholic Faith. Their stubborn pride (hardness of heart) doesn’t budge an inch even when called to repentance by their pastors or bishops. During my 21 years as a priest, I’ve been at many bedsides of people who will be meeting their Maker soon. The time has come, so to speak, to pay the piper. I’ve

seen fear, I’ve seen complacency, I’ve seen resignation and I’ve seen stubborn pride at this time that comes for us all. Sadly, many people, including Catholics, are not prepared to face their Creator. They have lived for the world for so long, put off repentance for so long, put off having a relationship with Jesus for so long, that they literally just don’t care or have the strength anymore. This is so very sad, for Jesus mercifully gives us until our last breath to utter, “I’m sorry. Please forgive me.” This is how much He loves us! He offers us salvation until the last second of our lives. Of course, this is also what enrages Satan, who saves his most vociferous attacks on us until our final moments. My advice then is the following: since we never know when death will come knocking at our door, do not put off Confession and amending your life. Whether you are 18 or 80 turn to the Lord now and do not listen to Satan as he whispers in your ear, “It’s too late for me. My fate is sealed.” Now, let us look at an inspirational homily about greed, some saintly quotes on this topic and read about what happens to those who die without repentance.

WISE ADVICE

~VANITY & GREED~

“ ... [I]n today’s first reading taken from the Book of Wisdom the word vanity is applied to everything that is not directed toward God, everything that is directed toward the things of this world. Vanity of vanities, says Qoheleth, vanity of vanities! All things are vanity! Here is one who has labored with wisdom and knowledge and skill, and yet to another who has not labored over it, he must leave property. This also is vanity and a great misfortune. For what profit comes to man from all the toil and anxiety of heart with which he has labored under the sun? All his days sorrow and grief are his occupation; even at night his mind is not at rest. This also is vanity. That’s practical advice. How many sleepless nights have we spent tossing and turning with worries and concerns that either have not come to pass or which we eventually realize were ultimately worthless? St. Paul likewise gives us wise advice found in today’s second reading when he tells us we should rid ourselves of immorality, impurity, passion, lustful desires and all of the fool’s

IS MY SOUL PREPARED?

~A VISION OF HELL~

Before reading this excerpt from the diary of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, let us all ask ourselves: if I were to die suddenly, what would be my fate? Have I stored up riches here to the exclusion of riches in heaven? Am I in a state of grace? With these questions in mind, here is a diary entry about one of her visions of hell: "Today I was led by an Angel to the chasms of hell. It is a place of great torture; how awesomely large and extensive it is! The kinds of tortures I saw: the first torture that constitutes hell is the loss of God; the second is perpetual remorse of conscience; the third is that one's condition will never change; the fourth is the fire that will penetrate the soul without destroying it – a terrible suffering, since it is a purely spiritual fire, lit by God's anger; the fifth torture is continual darkness and a terrible suffocating smell, and, despite the darkness, the devils and the souls of the damned see each other and all the evil, both of others and their own; the sixth torture is the constant company of Satan; the seventh torture is horrible despair, hatred of God, vile words, curses and blasphemies. [...] Each soul undergoes terrible and indescribable sufferings, related to the manner in which it has sinned. There are caverns and pits of torture where one form of agony differs from another. [...] But I noticed one thing: that most of the souls there are those who disbelieved that there is a hell. When I came to, I could hardly recover from the fright. How terribly souls suffer there!" gold offered us by the worldly. Why? Because in the long run, all such things are worthless and empty and all of our energies devoted to those things will be vain. Is lusting the path to happiness? What will it all mean and what value will it have when we meet Christ face to face? ... In the end, like the man Jesus was talking about in today's Gospel account, the man who was so concerned about the things of this world, we may hear God saying to us: *'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?'*

~JESUS GIVES US FAIR WARNING~

"Jesus gives us fair warning in telling us: "Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God." On the day we die, what can we give back to God that came to us from this life, a life that He gave to you and to me? Will it be our real estate holdings? A big bank account? Our popularity? Fine clothes? A fancy car? Death, the great leveler, will render what this world values to be valueless. Vanity of vanities, says Qoheleth, vanity of vanities! All things are vanity! God wants us to die rich; He wants us to give Him a life that has value, a life that was lived well, rich in meaning and not lived in vain. What He wants and what we can give Him, regardless of our economic position or our social status, is a spirit, a soul that is richly adorned with attitudes and personality characteristics that are similar to those of Jesus Christ. The riches of this world are extrinsic to our souls rather than intrinsic. We should be pursuing what is intrinsic and will be part of us forever rather than what is extrinsic and will disappear when we die. ...Worldly people are afraid to die. Their feelings of self-worth are centered on things, not on virtues. The worldly would have us think the only place to have happiness is here in this world. They adorn themselves with the cosmetics of this world and attempt to cover death with cosmetics. The world values us by what we have of this world's trinkets rather than by what we can give to God when we die. We stew too much, stew over what we don't have. We stew over our losses, about preserving what we've got. But the truth is that each day has its own gains, its own gifts along with some losses. *We need to value what really matters, what is of lasting value, not what is passing. We need to value the love we have given, the love of God that can be present in the love we have given to others.*" For complete homily, by Fr. MI FE CATOLICA

CODICIA Y ETERNIDAD

~DEL PASTOR~

Nuestras lecturas de hoy hablan de la codicia. ¿Qué es exactamente la codicia? La codicia es un deseo egoísta y excesivo de obtener más de algo (como dinero o posesiones). Las palabras clave en esta definición son "egoísta" y "excesivo". Los cristianos a menudo luchan con la noción de avaricia en el sentido de que quieren proveer bien a sus familias pero no quieren cometer este pecado particular en la búsqueda de esta meta. Por supuesto, no hay nada malo en trabajar duro con el objetivo de tener una casa más grande a medida que la familia crece o de iniciar fondos para la universidad de los hijos. Como padres responsables, estas cosas son buenas en sí mismas. La zona de peligro, por supuesto, es si esta meta se convierte en una obsesión, causando estrés y, en última instancia, falta de confianza en el amor y la santa voluntad de Dios. Vemos en nuestra primera lectura: "¿De qué le sirve al hombre todo el trabajo y la angustia del corazón...? "Luego, San Pablo nos dice en nuestra segunda lectura: "Haced morir, pues, las partes de vosotros que son terrenales: la inmoralidad, la impureza, la pasión, el mal deseo y la codicia que es idolatría". Y finalmente, San Lucas recoge que Jesús dijo: "Cuidaos de toda avaricia, porque aunque uno sea rico, la vida no consiste en los bienes". Y nos dice que cuando la muerte llegue repentinamente a los que han acumulado riquezas para lo que creen que será un futuro glorioso, su avaricia los condenará. ("Así será para todos los que acumulan tesoros para sí mismos, pero no son ricos en lo que le importa a Dios"). Hay mucho que desmenuzar aquí, incluyendo nuestro Salmo Responsorial que nos dice que no endurezcamos nuestros corazones contra Dios. Un corazón duro es un corazón obstinado, un corazón orgulloso. La única manera de combatir un corazón duro es con humildad, porque es la humildad la que abre nuestros corazones a la gracia. La soberbia, como la avaricia, es idolatría, pues uno se hace un ídolo de sí mismo, es decir, me convierto en mi propio dios, sabiendo lo que está bien o mal, etc. Vemos esto de manera bastante descarada con los políticos católicos que sostienen creencias que son diametralmente opuestas a la fe católica. Su obstinado orgullo (dureza de corazón) no cede ni un ápice incluso cuando son llamados al arrepentimiento por sus pastores u obispos.

"Durante mis 21 años como sacerdote, he estado al lado de la cama de muchas personas que pronto se encontrarán con su Creador. Ha llegado el momento, por así decirlo, de pagar el pato. He visto miedo, he visto complacencia, he visto resignación y he visto orgullo obstinado en este momento que nos llega a todos. Lamentablemente, la mayoría de las personas, incluidos los católicos, no están preparadas para enfrentarse a su Creador. Han vivido para el mundo durante tanto tiempo, han pospuesto el arrepentimiento durante tanto tiempo, han pospuesto tener una relación con Jesús durante tanto tiempo, que literalmente ya no les importa o no tienen fuerzas. Esto es tan increíblemente triste, porque Jesús misericordiosamente nos da hasta nuestro último aliento para pronunciar: "Lo siento. Por favor, perdóname". ¡Esto es lo mucho que Él nos ama! Nos ofrece la salvación hasta el último segundo de nuestra vida. Por supuesto, esto es también lo que enfurece a Satanás, que guarda sus ataques más ruidosos contra nosotros hasta nuestros últimos momentos. Mi consejo, pues, es el siguiente: como nunca sabemos cuándo la muerte llamará a nuestra puerta, no pospongas la confesión y la enmienda de tu vida. Tanto si tienes 18 como 80 años (yo he enterrado a muchos de los dos) acude al Señor ahora y no escuches a Satanás cuando te susurre al oído: "Es demasiado tarde para mí. Mi destino está sellado". Ahora, veamos una homilía inspiradora, algunas citas de santos y leamos lo que les ocurre a los que mueren sin arrepentirse.
