MY CATHOLIC FAITH

PURGATORY

~FROM THE PASTOR~

In today's Gospel reading, we read, "That servant who knew his master's will but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master's will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly." What exactly are we to make of this? Let's take a look at an interesting article which points out that this passage evokes the doctrine of Purgatory. Purgatory is a teaching that is often misunderstood (or not believed) by Catholics and non-Catholics alike, so let us read on ...

SCRIPTURE SPEAKS OF IT

~NOT JUST A CATHOLIC THING~

"If somebody ever says that Purgatory is foreign to Christianity and is just a "Catholic" thing, take them to Luke 12. For Jesus Himself speaks of it, saying, *'Peter said, "Lord, are you telling this parable for us or for all?" And the Lord said, "Who then is the faithful and wise steward, whom his master will set over his household, to give them their portion of food at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master when he comes will find so doing. Truly, I tell you, he will set him over all his possessions. But if that servant says to himself, 'My master is delayed in coming,' and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants, and to eat and drink and get drunk, the master of that servant will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour he does not know, and will punish him, and put him with the unfaithful. And that servant who knew his master's will, but did not make ready or act according to his will, shall receive a severe beating. But he who did not know, and did what deserved a beating, shall receive a light beating. Every one to whom much is given, of him will much be required; and of him to whom men commit much they will demand the more.'*

Jesus is speaking of how His final coming will be like a thief in the night. Those who are prepared for His coming will enter into eternal life. Now, if a thief was coming to your house, it'd be difficult to sleep, because there'd be a certain level of anxiety. ... [T]o drive this point home, Jesus speaks of four different outcomes."

~THE OUTCOMES~

"**The first** is ready for the thief, because he is a servant of the master and does good work for Him consistently. Heaven is his end. **The next** is someone who is a servant of God, the Master, but does evil. He becomes slothful in doing good work for the master and beats his servants and is glutinous in food and drink. So, the master will, to translate it literally, "cut him in pieces" or "dismember him," implying death, and put him with the unfaithful (Hell). So far, these two options are typical of Jesus' preaching. Such as his parable about the sheep and the goats. But, it gets more interesting from here. **The next servant** is somebody who becomes slothful, but does not beat his servants. He is less grievous in his laziness/unpreparedness ... He knows what he should be doing, but doesn't do it. So, he gets a severe beating, and is not "cut in pieces" (dead). This man did not go to the extreme of beating his servants and committing gluttony. This is purgatory. **The final** servant is somebody who does not know the will of the master who will come at an unexpected time. He does evil, but was not explicitly told by the master what to do. So, this man only receives a "light" beating. This also is purgatory." *Thus, as we have seen, Jesus speaks of Purgatory. HELPING THE HOLY SOULS

~TEN WAYS TO HELP~

Here are ten ways we can pray for our deceased friends and relatives, and for all our brothers and sisters who have died in Christ.

1. **Pray the Novena to the Holy Souls** by St. Alphonsus Liguori.
2. **Offer up your Holy Communions** for the souls in purgatory.
3. **Have Masses said** for your departed loved ones, especially on the anniversary of his or her death.

THE SAINTS SPEAK

~ST. JOHN VIANNEY~

The fire of Purgatory is the same as the fire of Hell; the difference between them is that the fire of Purgatory is not everlasting.

If it were but known how great is the power of the good souls in Purgatory with the Heart of God, and if we knew all the graces we can obtain through their intercession, they would not be so much forgotten. We must, therefore, pray much for them, that they may pray much for us.

What years of Purgatory will there be for those Christians who have no difficulty at all in deferring their prayers to another time on the excuse of having to do some pressing work! If we really desired the happiness of possessing God, we should avoid the little faults as well as the big ones, since separation from God is so frightful a torment to all these poor souls!

~ST. ALPHONSUS DE LIGUORI~

... is not he a fool who seeks after happiness in this world, where he will remain only a few days and exposes himself to the risk of being unhappy in the next, where we must live fore eternity? We do not fix our affections on borrowed goods, because we know that they must soon be returned to the owner. All the goods of this earth are lent to us...

The practice of recommending to God the souls in Purgatory, that He may mitigate the great pains which they suffer, and that He may soon bring them to His glory, is most pleasing to the Lord and most profitable to us. For these blessed souls are His eternal spouses, and most grateful are they to those who obtain their deliverance from prison, or even a mitigation of their torments. When, therefore, they arrive in Heaven, they will be sure to remember all who have prayed for them.

~ST. AUGUSTINE~

Temporal punishments are suffered by some in this life only, by some after death, by some both here and hereafter, but all of them before that last and strictest judgment. But not all who suffer temporal punishments after death will come to eternal punishments, which are to follow after that judgment."

4. Pray the **Divine Mercy Chaplet** for the intention of the Holy Souls.
5. **Eucharistic Adoration:** visit the Blessed Sacrament to make acts of reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on behalf of those in purgatory.
6. **Sacrifices:** practice small acts of self-denial throughout your day and offer these penances up for the poor souls.
7. **Give alms:** The giving of material assistance to the poor has always been considered a penance that can be offered for the Holy Souls. *"For almsgiving saves from death, and purges all sin"* (**Tobit 12:9**).
8. **Ask for the intercession of saints** who were known to be great friends of the Holy Souls during their lifetime to join you in prayer for the faithful departed: St. Nicholas of Tolentino, St. Gertrude the Great, St. Catherine of Genoa, St. Padre Pio, St. Philip Neri, St. John Macías, St. Faustina Kowalska, St. Joseph, Our Lady, Etc.
9. **When passing by a cemetery:** Pray the short Eternal Rest prayer: *"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let the perpetual light shine upon them. And may the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."*
10. **Pray to earn indulgences for the holy souls:** On all the days from November 1 to November 8, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed (standard requirements for indulgences apply*). Partial indulgences are granted to those who recite Lauds or Vespers of the Office of the Dead, and to those who recite the prayer, *"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace"*. * *The usual conditions for obtaining a plenary indulgence apply, including sacramental confession, the reception of Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father, as well as complete detachment from all sin, even venial sin.* <https://cathdal.org/home/ten-ways-to-pray-for-the-holy-souls-in-purgatory> Ten Ways to Pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory

LA REALIDAD DEL PURGATORIO

~DEL PASTOR~

En la lectura del Evangelio de hoy, leemos: "Aquel siervo que conocía la voluntad de su amo, pero no hizo los preparativos ni actuó de acuerdo con su voluntad, será golpeado con severidad; y el siervo que ignoraba la voluntad de su amo, pero actuó de manera que merecía una paliza severa, será golpeado sólo ligeramente". ¿Qué debemos entender exactamente de esto? Veamos un interesante artículo que señala que este pasaje evoca la doctrina del purgatorio. El purgatorio es una enseñanza que a menudo es malinterpretada (o no se cree) por católicos y no católicos, así que sigamos leyendo...

LAS ESCRITURAS HABLAN DE ELLO

~NO ES SÓLO UNA COSA CATÓLICA~

"Si alguien dice alguna vez que el purgatorio es ajeno al cristianismo y que es sólo una cosa "católica", llévenlo a Lucas 12. Porque el mismo Jesús habla de ello diciendo: "Pedro dijo: "Señor, ¿dices esta parábola para nosotros o para todos?". Y el Señor dijo: "¿Quién es, pues, el mayordomo fiel y prudente al que su amo pone al frente de su casa para que les dé su ración de comida a su debido tiempo? Bienaventurado aquel siervo a quien su señor, cuando venga, encuentre haciendo así. Os aseguro que le pondrá al frente de todos sus bienes. Pero si ese siervo se dice a sí mismo: "Mi señor tarda en venir", y empieza a golpear a los siervos y a las siervas, y a comer y beber y emborracharse, el señor de ese siervo vendrá un día que no lo espera y a una hora que no conoce, y lo castigará, y lo pondrá con los infieles. Y aquel siervo que conocía la voluntad de su amo, pero no se preparó ni actuó según su voluntad, recibirá una severa paliza. Pero el que no sabía, e hizo lo que merecía una paliza, recibirá una paliza leve. A todo aquel a quien se le dé mucho, se le exigirá mucho; y a aquel a quien se le dé mucho, se le exigirá más". Jesús está hablando de cómo su venida final será como un ladrón en la noche. Aquellos que estén preparados para su venida entrarán en la vida eterna. Ahora, si un ladrón viniera a tu casa, sería difícil dormir, porque habría un cierto nivel de ansiedad. ... [P]ara llevar este punto a casa, Jesús habla de cuatro resultados diferentes

~ LOS RESULTADOS ~

El primero está listo para el ladrón, porque es un siervo del amo y hace buen trabajo para Él constantemente. El cielo es su fin. El siguiente es alguien que es un siervo de Dios, el Maestro, pero hace el mal. Se vuelve perezoso en hacer un buen trabajo para el amo y golpea a sus sirvientes y es glotón en la comida y la bebida. Entonces, el amo, para traducirlo literalmente, "lo cortará en pedazos" o "lo desmembrará", lo que implica la muerte, y lo pondrá con los infieles (el infierno). Hasta aquí, estas dos opciones son típicas de la predicación de Jesús. Como su parábola sobre las ovejas y las cabras. Pero, la cosa se pone más interesante a partir de aquí. El siguiente siervo es alguien que se vuelve perezoso, pero no golpea a sus siervos. Es menos grave en su pereza/despreocupación... Sabe lo que debería hacer, pero no lo hace. Por lo tanto, recibe una severa paliza, y no es "cortado en pedazos" (muerto). Este hombre no llegó al extremo de golpear a sus sirvientes y cometer gula. Esto es el purgatorio. El siervo final es alguien que no conoce la voluntad del amo que vendrá en un momento inesperado. Hace el mal, pero el amo no le dijo explícitamente lo que tenía que hacer. Por lo tanto, este hombre sólo recibe una paliza "ligera". Esto también es el purgatorio". Así, como hemos visto, Jesús habla del purgatorio. AYUDA A LAS ALMAS SANTAS

~DIEZ MANERAS DE AYUDAR~

He aquí diez maneras de rezar por nuestros amigos y parientes difuntos, y por todos nuestros hermanos y hermanas que han muerto en Cristo.

1. Rezar la Novena a las Almas Santas de San Alfonso de Ligorio.
2. Ofrece tus santas comuniones por las almas del purgatorio.
3. Haz que se celebren misas por tus seres queridos difuntos, especialmente en el aniversario de su muerte.

4. *Reza la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia por la intención de las Almas Santas.*

5. *Adoración eucarística: visitar el Santísimo Sacramento para hacer actos de reparación al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús en favor de los que están en el purgatorio.*

6. *Sacrificios: practica pequeños actos de abnegación a lo largo del día y ofrece estas penitencias por las almas pobres.*

7. *Dar limosna: La entrega de ayuda material a los pobres siempre se ha considerado una penitencia que se puede ofrecer por las Almas Santas. "Porque la limosna salva de la muerte y purga todo pecado" (Tobías 12:9).*

Pide la intercesión de los santos que fueron conocidos por ser grandes amigos de las Almas Santas durante su vida para que se unan a ti en la oración por los fieles difuntos: San Nicolás de Tolentino, Santa Gertrudis la Grande, Santa Catalina de Génova, San Padre Pío, San Felipe Neri, San Juan Macías, Santa Faustina Kowalska, San José, Nuestra Señora, etc.

9. *Al pasar por un cementerio: Reza la breve oración del Descanso Eterno: "Concédeles, Señor, el descanso eterno. Y que la luz perpetua brille sobre ellos. Y que las almas de todos los fieles difuntos, por la misericordia de Dios, descansen en paz. Amén".*

10. *Reza para ganar indulgencias por las almas santas: Todos los días del 1 al 8 de noviembre se concede indulgencia plenaria, aplicable sólo a las Ánimas Pobres, a quienes visiten un cementerio y recen, aunque sea mentalmente, por los difuntos (se aplican los requisitos estándar para las indulgencias*). Se conceden indulgencias parciales a quienes recen Laudes o Vísperas del Oficio de Difuntos, y a quienes recen la oración: "Concédeles, Señor, el descanso eterno y haz que brille para ellos la luz perpetua. Que descansen en paz". * Se aplican las condiciones habituales para obtener la indulgencia plenaria, incluyendo la confesión sacramental, la recepción de la Sagrada Comunión y la oración por las intenciones del Santo Padre, así como el desprendimiento completo de todo pecado, incluso el venial.*
