2023 Lenten Regulations for the Diocese of Santa Rosa

“The Lenten Season has a double character, namely to prepare both catechumens and faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. The **catechumens**, both with the Rite of Election and Scrutinies, and by catechesis, are prepared for the celebration of the sacraments of Christian initiation; the **faithful**, ever more attentive to the Word of God and prayer, prepare themselves by penance for the renewal of their baptismal promises. (*From: The Order of Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours and the Celebration of the Eucharist*)

The current discipline is as follows:

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of *fast* and *abstinence*, that is, limited to a single, full meal and abstinence from meat.

The other Fridays of Lent are days of *abstinence* from meat.

The law of *fasting* permits only one full meal a day, but it does allow the taking of some food in the morning and a second light meal at noon or in the evening, as you prefer. Persons who have completed their eighteenth year to the beginning of their sixtieth (60) year are obligated to fast.

The law of *abstinence* from meat applies to all persons who have completed their *fourteenth* year of age.

However, it is highly recommended that children from ages *seven* to *fourteen* years also follow the law of **abstinence**.

All Catholics are encouraged to receive Holy Eucharist frequently during Lent and to receive the Sacrament of Penance so that all may be prepared to celebrate more fully the paschal mystery. Those who have received their first Holy Communion are to receive Holy Communion during the Easter season.

The determination of these days of obligatory penance, as listed above, should not be understood as limiting the occasions for Christian penance. This penance is to help us see and shorten the distance between our present lives and the life God wants for each of us. “Penance should not be only internal and individual but external and social.” (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy #110)

Marriages may be celebrated with Mass and the nuptial blessing should always be given. It is, however, contrary to the spirit of penance during Lent to plan an elaborate wedding with lavish decorations.

Confirmation at the Easter Vigil: Canon Law grants to pastors and parochial vicars the faculty to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation, within their proper parish, to any adult or child over the age of seven years on the occasion of his/her baptism or received into full communion with the Church.

LENTEN IDEAS

~FROM THE PASTOR~

Every year, Catholics ask themselves the same questions: What should I “give up” for Lent? Or, “What can I do to get more out of Lent this year?” In the spirit of giving Fatherly advice, I would like to share a few ideas that may help you have a more spiritually rewarding Lent this year. Let us read on ...

LENTEN IDEAS

~THINGS TO GIVE UP~

Listening to Music in the Car. Our society is in dire need of quiet time. Whether you’re driving to work or running errands, resist the urge to mindlessly turn on the radio or iTunes. Use this quiet time to grow closer to God through prayer, reflection or just peaceful silence.

Complaining. We are living in very difficult, evil times and there is indeed much to complain about, but, resist the urge. Instead, count your blessings and don’t give negativity a foothold. The devil uses negativity to create feelings of despair and hostility. Don’t give him an inch!

Your Cell Phone. It is amazing how conditioned all of us are to pick up our phones multiple times each day and mindlessly scroll through Facebook and YouTube or send texts to our friends. Let us resist the urge and remind ourselves that on Judgement Day, we will have to give an account of every second that we wasted. God gives us time on earth to serve Him and each other, not to engage in frivolous activities. Put down your phone and pick up your Bible!

Immodest Speech/Attire. As Christians, we must set an example so that others can come to know Christ through us. The best form of evangelization is what we say and do. Cursing, swearing, immodest jokes and tight-fitting or revealing clothing should disappear during Lent (and beyond!)

~THINGS TO ADD~

1. Get up earlier than anyone else in your house and spend your first 15 minutes of the day thanking God for the gift of life and offering your day to Him.

2. Make a decision to read at least some Scripture every day.

3. Make the Stations of the Cross each Friday either with a group or by yourself. If you have kids, bring them.

4. Make it a habit to stop at least five times a day, raise your heart and mind to God, and say a short prayer such as “Jesus, I love you,” or “Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner,” or “Lord, I offer it up for you.”

5. Pray for the millions of Christians suffering under persecution in various Muslim and Communist countries around the world such as the Sudan, Pakistan, Indonesia, China, Viet Nam, and North Korea. (Pray your Rosary every day for this intention and other intentions that are dear to you.)

6. Find a written biography of a Saint that particularly appeals to you, and read it during Lent.

7. Get to know the Fathers of the Church and read selections from them along with Scripture.

Regulaciones para la Cuaresma del 2023 en la Diócesis de Santa Rosa

““El tiempo de Cuaresma tiene un doble carácter, principalmente para preparar a los catecúmenos y a los fieles para celebrar el misterio pascual. Los **catecúmenos**, con el Rito de la Elección y los Escrutinios y por la catequesis son preparados para la celebración de los sacramentos de la iniciación cristiana; los **fieles**, por una mayor atención a la Palabra de Dios y a la oración, se preparan ellos mismos por la penitencia para la renovación de las promesas bautismales. *Tomado de El Orden de la Oración en la Liturgia de las Horas y la Celebración de la Eucaristía.*

La disciplina actual es como sigue:

Miércoles de Ceniza y Viernes Santo son días de **ayuno y abstinencia**, esto es, limitarse a una sola y completa comida y abstenerse de comer carne.

Los demás Viernes de Cuaresma son días de **abstinencia**

Las leyes del ayuno permiten una sola comida al día pero es posible tomar algo ligero en la mañana o según se prefiera, al mediodía o la noche. Las personas en buen estado de salud entre 18 y 60 años de edad están obligadas a ayunar.

Las leyes de **abstinencia** de comer carne obligan a los mayores de 14 años. Sin embargo es altamente recomendable que niños entre 7 a 14 años también cumplan con la práctica de la abstinencia.

A todos los católicos se les recomienda recibir la Santa Comunión frecuentemente durante la cuaresma y recibir el sacramento de la Penitencia de manera que puedan estar preparados para celebrar más conscientemente el Misterio Pascual. Aquellos que han recibido su Primera Comunión, deben recibir la Santa Comunión durante el tiempo Pascual.

La determinación de los días obligatorios de penitencia, como está arriba, no debe ser entendida como limitante de la práctica de la penitencia. La penitencia es para ayudarnos a ver y acortar la distancia entre nuestras vidas presente la vida que Dios quiere para cada uno de nosotros. “La penitencia del tiempo cuaresmal no debe ser sólo interna e individual, sino también externa y social.” (Sacrosanctum Concilium #110)

Los **matrimonios** pueden celebrarse con la misa y siempre se debe dar la bendición nupcial. Sin embargo es contrario al espíritu de la cuaresma elaborar las bodas con muchas decoraciones o flores.

Confirmación en la Vigilia Pascual: El Derecho Canónico da a los Pastores y vicarios parroquiales la facultad de administrar el Sacramento de la Confirmación en sus parroquias a cualquier adulto o niño/a mayor de siete años quienes en ocasión de su bautismo o que están siendo recibidos en completa comunión a la Iglesia.

IDEAS PARA CUARESMA

~COSAS QUE DEJAR~

Escuchar música en el coche. Nuestra sociedad necesita urgentemente momentos de tranquilidad. Si estás conduciendo al trabajo o haciendo mandados, resiste el impulso de encender la radio o iTunes sin pensar. Utiliza este tiempo para acercarte más a Dios a través de la oración, la reflexión o el silencio.

Quejarse. Vivimos tiempos muy difíciles y malvados y hay mucho de lo que quejarse, pero resiste la tentación. En lugar de eso, cuenta tus bendiciones y no des pie a la negatividad. El diablo utiliza la negatividad para crear sentimientos de desesperación y hostilidad. ¡No le des ni una pulgada!

Su Teléfono Celular. Es asombroso lo condicionados que estamos a usar nuestros teléfonos varias veces al día y navegar sin pensar por Facebook y YouTube o enviar mensajes de texto a nuestros amigos. Resistamos el impulso y recordemos que en el Día del Juicio, tendremos que dar cuenta de cada segundo que desperdiciamos. Dios nos da tiempo en la tierra para servirle a Él y a los demás, no para dedicarnos a actividades frívolas. Deja tu teléfono y lee tu Biblia.

Discurso/Atuendo Inmodesto. Como cristianos, debemos dar el ejemplo para que otros puedan conocer a Cristo a través de nosotros. La mejor forma de evangelización es lo que decimos y hacemos. Maldecir, decir palabrotas, bromas inmodestas y ropa ajustada o reveladora deben desaparecer durante la Cuaresma (¡y después!).

~COSAS QUE AÑADIR~

1. Levántate antes que nadie en tu casa y dedica tus primeros 15 minutos del día a dar gracias a Dios por el don de la vida y a ofrecerle tu día a Él.
2. Decídete a leer al menos algo de las Escrituras cada día.
3. Haz el Vía Crucis cada viernes, ya sea con un grupo o tú solo. Si tienes niños, llévalos.
4. Acostúmbrate a detenerte al menos cinco veces al día, eleva tu corazón y tu mente a Dios, y reza una breve oración como "Jesús, te amo", o "Señor Jesucristo, Hijo de Dios, ten piedad de mí, pecador", o "Señor, lo ofrezco por ti".
5. Reza por los millones de cristianos que sufren persecución en diversos países musulmanes y comunistas del mundo, como Sudán, Pakistán, Indonesia, China, Vietnam y Corea del Norte. (Reza tu Rosario todos los días por esta intención y por otras intenciones que te sean queridas)
6. Busca una biografía escrita de un santo que te atraiga especialmente y léela durante la Cuaresma.
7. Conoce a los Padres de la Iglesia y lee fragmentos de ellos junto con las Escrituras.
