~ USED BOOK SALE~





MY CATHOLIC FAITH

ON HOLINESS AND PRAYER

~FROM THE PASTOR~

"Having dismissed the multitude, He went into a mountain alone to pray." ---Matthew 14:23 This quote from today's Gospel reading prompted me to focus today on attaining holiness. We all know that our salvation depends on having a solid prayer life and on living a good, holy life, yet how many of us are willing to carve out time in our busy lives to really, truly talk to and LISTEN TO God? To guide us along this path of prayer and holiness, I would like to turn to that great Doctor of the Church, St. Alphonsus Liguori. Let us look at an excerpt from his writings on, "The Twelve Steps to Holiness."

~THREE NECESSARY INGREDIENTS~

"To preserve recollection of spirit or the constant union of the soul with God, three things are necessary: solitude, silence and the recollection of the presence of God. It was these three things which the Angel of God referred to when, addressing St. Arsenius, he said: "Flee, be silent and rest." In other words: seek solitude, practice silence, and rest in God by keeping the thought of His presence ever before you. "

~SOLITUDE~

"Souls that love God feel a strong attraction for solitude, for they know that God converses familiarly with those who shun the noise and distractions of the world. "O blessed solitude," exclaims St. Jerome, "in which God with loving condescension deals familiarly with chosen souls!" God does not speak in those places where time is squandered in loud laughter and idle talk. "The Lord is not in the earthquake" (3 Kgs. 19: 11), but He says, on the contrary, in the words of the prophet Osee: "I will lead her into the wilderness and I will speak to her heart." (Osee 2:14). St. Eucherius relates that a person who desired to be perfect once asked a spiritual director what he had to do, and this was the answer he received: "Solitude is the place where man finds God. In solitude, virtue is easily preserved; in intercourse with the world it is easily lost. In order to remain united to God, we must endeavor to keep alive within us a vivid recollection of Him and of the immeasurable goods He bestows on them that love Him. By constant intercourse with the

world, these spiritual truths are apt to become obscured in the maze of earthly thoughts and considerations, and piety vanishes from the heart. Worldlyminded people shun solitude, and it is quite natural for them to do so; for it is in retirement that they are troubled with qualms of conscience. They seek the society and excitement of the world so that the voice of conscience may be drowned in the noise that reigns there. Those, on the contrary, whose conscience is at rest, love solitude and retirement; and when at times they are obliged by circumstances to appear in the noisy world, they are ill at ease and feel altogether out of their element. Many complain that they are unable to find God, but to such St. Teresa replies: "Tear your heart away from everything else; then seek God and you will surely find Him." If a crystal vase is filled with earth, the rays of the sun cannot penetrate it. The light of God cannot illumine a heart that is full of attachments for the joys, the pleasures and the honors of this world. "

~SILENCE~

"Silence is one of the principal means to attain the spirit of prayer and to fit oneself for uninterrupted intercourse with God. It is hard to find a truly pious person who talks much. But they who have the spirit of prayer love silence, which has deservedly been called a protectress of innocence, a shield against temptations and a fruitful source of prayer. Silence promotes recollection and awakens good thoughts in the heart. According to St. Bernard, it forces the soul, as it were, to think of God and heavenly things. For this reason the Saints of God were great lovers of Silence. ... Unrestrained and immoderate talking, on the other hand, has many disastrous consequences. If devotion is preserved by silence, it is certainly lost by much talking. A person may be ever so recollected at meditation; if afterwards he does not restrain his tongue, he will be as distracted as if he had made no meditation at all. ... Ah, how many souls will be lost on judgment day because they have not watched over their tongue! "The virtue of silence does not consist in never speaking, but in keeping silent when there is no good reason to speak. ... St. Francis de Sales quaintly remarked: "To avoid faults in speech we must have the lips buttoned together, so that while unbuttoning them we may think of what we are For the complete article go to: http:// going to say." catholictradition.org/Tradition/silence2.htm

SOBRE LA SANTIDAD Y LA ORACIÓN

~DEL PÁSTOR~

"Habiendo despedido a la multitud, se fue solo a un monte a orar". ---Mateo 14:23 Esta cita de la lectura del Evangelio de hoy me impulsó a centrarme hoy en alcanzar la santidad. Todos sabemos que nuestra salvación depende de tener una vida de oración sólida y de vivir una vida buena y santa, sin embargo, ¿cuántos de nosotros estamos dispuestos a sacar tiempo en nuestras vidas ocupadas para realmente hablar con Dios y ESCUCHARLO? Para guiarnos por este camino de oración y de santidad, quisiera dirigirme a ese gran Doctor de la Iglesia, San Alfonso María de Ligorio. Veamos un extracto de sus escritos sobre "Los Doce Pasos hacia la Santidad".

~TRES INGREDIENTES NECESARIOS~

"Para conservar el recogimiento de espíritu o la unión constante del alma con Dios, son necesarias tres cosas: la soledad, el silencio y el recogimiento de la presencia de Dios. A estas tres cosas se refirió el Ángel de Dios cuando, dirigiéndose a San Arsenio, dijo: "Huye, calla y descansa". En otras palabras: busque la soledad, practique el silencio y descanse en Dios manteniendo el pensamiento de Su presencia siempre ante usted. "

~ SOLEDAD ~

"Las almas que aman a Dios sienten una fuerte atracción por la soledad, porque saben que Dios conversa familiarmente con los que rehúyen el ruido y las distracciones del mundo. "¡Oh bendita soledad", exclama San Jerónimo, "en la que Dios con amorosa condescendencia trata familiarmente a las almas elegidas!" Dios no habla en esos lugares donde se desperdicia el tiempo en risas a carcajadas y charlas ociosas. "El Señor no está en el terremoto" (3 Reyes 19, 11), sino que dice, por el contrario, en las palabras del profeta Osee: "La llevaré al desierto y hablaré a su corazón. " (Oseas 2:14). Cuenta que san Euquerio una persona que deseaba ser perfecta preguntó una vez a un director espiritual qué tenía que hacer, y esta fue la respuesta que recibió: "La soledad es el lugar donde el hombre encuentra a Dios. En la soledad se conserva fácilmente la virtud; en el trato con el mundo se pierde fácilmente. Para permanecer unidos a Dios, debemos esforzarnos por mantener vivo en nosotros un recuerdo vivo de Él y de los bienes inconmensurables que Él concede a los que Le aman. Por relaciones \rightarrow

constantes con el mundo, estas verdades espirituales tienden a oscurecerse en el laberinto de pensamientos y consideraciones terrenales, y la piedad se desvanece del corazón. Las personas de mentalidad mundana evitan la soledad, y es muy natural que lo hagan; porque es en el retiro cuando se ven perturbados por remordimientos de conciencia. Buscan la sociedad y la excitación del mundo para que la voz de la conciencia se ahogue en el ruido que allí reina. Aquellos, por el contrario, cuya conciencia está tranquila, aman la soledad y el retiro; y cuando a veces las circunstancias los obligan a aparecer en el mundo ruidoso, se sienten incómodos y completamente fuera de su elemento. Muchos se quejan de que son incapaces de encontrar a Dios, pero Santa Teresa les responde: "Arranca tu corazón de todo lo demás; luego busca a Dios y seguramente lo encontrarás". Si un vaso de cristal está lleno de tierra, los rayos del sol no pueden penetrarlo. La luz de Dios no puede iluminar un corazón lleno de apegos por las alegrías, los placeres y los honores de este mundo. "

~SILENCIO~

"El silencio es uno de los principales medios para alcanzar el espíritu de oración y prepararse para una relación ininterrumpida con Dios. Es difícil encontrar una persona verdaderamente piadosa que hable mucho. Pero los que tienen espíritu de oración aman el silencio, al que con razón se ha llamado protector de la inocencia, escudo contra las tentaciones y fuente fecunda de oración. El silencio favorece el recogimiento y despierta buenos pensamientos en el corazón. Según San Bernardo, obliga al alma, por así decirlo, a pensar en Dios y en las cosas celestiales. Por eso los Santos de Dios eran grandes amantes del Silencio. ... Hablar sin restricciones y sin moderación, por otro lado, tiene muchas consecuencias desastrosas. Si la devoción se conserva con el silencio, ciertamente se pierde con mucho hablar. Una persona puede estar muy concentrada en la meditación; si después no refrena su lengua, estará tan distraído como si no hubiera hecho ninguna meditación. ... ¡Ay, cuántas almas se perderán el día del juicio por no haber cuidado su lengua! "La virtud del silencio no consiste en no hablar nunca, sino en callar cuando no hay una buena razón para hablar. ... San Francisco de Sales comentó curiosamente: "Para evitar faltas en el habla, debemos tener los labios apretados, para que mientras los desabrochamos podamos pensar en lo que vamos a decir".
