#### PASTOR'S CORNER

We now begin with the Ordinary Time of the new year in the Gospel of Mark. Ordinary Time is our usual and normal season of growth as Christians. Though we especially should grow in faith during the special seasons, that does not mean that we take the rest of the year off. There is no vacation from being a Catholic. When we say "Ordinary Time" we can also think of it as Ordinal Time, as in counting our way through the year. The term ordinary is not meant to indicate that nothing special is happening. It simply means that this is the rest of the time that we have apart from the special seasons.

This year we focus on the Gospel of Mark which is the shortest of the Gospels. Yet we know that that does not make it boring. I truly want to encourage everyone to spend some time in January reading through the entire Gospel of Mark. It really helps you to get a better sense of the story by reading through the Gospel as it is written. The readings on Sunday give us the highlights and the general sense of what happens in Mark, but they cannot cover everything. We should show the initiative to read through the Gospel and let its message permeate into our minds and hearts.
