PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

We read today of the power of the word. Sometimes we think of spoken words as being something trivial, as if words do not really matter. In certain contexts, this may be true. People frequently say that they want action, not more words. Fair enough. We get both with our God. We recall that in Genesis 1, God created all that exists not by thinking, or feeling, or willing it, but by speaking it into being. The first words being: "let there be light," and so it was. God's word is efficacious.

Additionally, we know as Catholics that God's Word is a Person: Jesus Christ. He has come into this world in order to effect a lasting change, in order to bring about our salvation by means of His Grace. As this story unfolds in the Gospel of Mark, we see how Mark sets up the reader to believe that Jesus is in fact God by His works. Only God can speak and have things happen as a result of that speech. Here Jesus speaks and His word produces a definite result. By His Word evil is expelled, grace is multiplied, and healing moves from hope to reality.

This reminds us all the more to study the written Word of God, especially the Gospels which contain real and truthful accounts of Jesus' life and deeds. Reading through the Gospel of Mark is a worthwhile and fruitful activity that we should all do as we begin this year of reading through Mark in the Mass.
